

## WHAT IS **COMMUNITIES BUILDING BELONGING?**



### Communities Building Belonging is an

Asset-Based Community Development (ABCD) and Collective Impact movement aimed at deepening a sense of community in our cities and towns. Over the last five years, Communities Building Belonging (formerly known as Deepening Community) has been a timely and powerful response to the growing social isolation, loneliness and disconnection occurring across Canada.

Tamarack's Communities Building Belonging work has grown across Canada to address the need to build connected and resilient communities. The impact from this work within communities and across Canada is important.

By defining the field of Communities Building Belonging, we have done the following:

- Rooted the movement in a theoretical understanding of the issues and a practical understanding of what is happening on the ground in communities
- Helped implement a framework to develop positive change in communities
- Supported the acceleration of efforts and impacts locally

Our growing learning community of nearly 8,000 learners is building the foundation to spread this movement throughout the rest of Canada. With the growing sense of disconnection and social isolation happening in cities and towns across Canada and the decrease in civic involvement in communities, we believe that Building Belonging is the answer.

Using an ABCD approach alongside Collective Impact, we support neighbourhoods, towns and cities to build their knowledge and skills to develop neighbourhood strategies.

Our goal is to help communities to achieve the following impacts:

- Increasing a sense of belonging to place and people
- Fostering equity and inclusion in the places people live
- Increasing a sense of citizenship (enabling care, raising our children together)
- Increasing a sense of resilience by stewarding local ecology and investing in disaster preparedness
- Increasing a sense of safety
- Increasing a sense of well-being and enabling health
- Investing in local community economic development and local food production

We support our **learners** by hosting online community of practices, webinars, events, producing publications that share our learnings.

In addition to these benefits. we support our members through specialized coaching.
