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- 1. Importance of building trust and relationships with youth for effective engagement.
- 2. Learning alongside youth to ensure sustainable and authentic feedback and conversation.
- 3. Engaging youth through community beautification activities.
- 4. Peer-to-peer engagement is more effective in obtaining honest and accurate feedback from youth.
- 5. Youth need to be at the forefront of leading actions and operations.
- 6. Actively reaching out to youth helps in identifying interested and enthusiastic youth.
- 7. Diversity among youth population and the importance of reaching beyond the engaged youth.
- 8. Meeting youth where they are to engage them.
- 9. Importance of consistent communication with youth to engage them.
- 10. Providing a safe space for youth to express their opinions and have their voices heard.






