

AREAS OF IMPACT AND SUPPORT

Communities Ending Poverty members focus on 4 areas of impact:

- 1. Supporting members to grow from start-up to sustainability
- 2. Developing a community-wide common agenda and poverty reduction plan
- 3. Tracking and reporting on outcomes
- 4. Achieving financial and leadership sustainability

We do so by offering 5 forms of supports:

- 1. Coaching and one-on-one Manager of Communities support
- 2. Peer learning (Communities of Practice and small group learning sessions)
- 3. Online learning (website, webinars, blogs, newsletters, and social media)
- 4. Face-to-face and virtual events (summits, member gatherings and courses)
- 5. Publications (case studies, tools, guides, and articles)




"We were finding, as a funder, that we were having to turn down a lot of applicants.
