Are you between the ages of 16-24 with an understanding of the barriers facing Yukon youth today? If so, we have a unique opportunity for you.

Project Description: Communities Building Youth Futures (CBYF) is a project centered around building actionable solutions to barriers youth face when graduating and transitioning out of high school. This process involves developing a *common agenda* of youth-led strategies to help youth serving organizations efficiently target these barriers.

Job Description: In this role you will gather and collect information from youth in your community through conversations and surveys. Successful candidates will conduct youth led, self-guided research to help understand what specific barriers northern youth are facing. You will also be expected to track and report your findings.

The second part of this role will be to take part in a weekly roundtable with the other youth interns and the CBYF manager. Through this meeting you will incorporate your findings into a common agenda. There will be on the job trainings and mentorship for each intern to develop hard skills such as research, community engagement, facilitation, and communication important in career development.

Job Duties:

- Work independently interviewing youth in your community
- Take part in weekly meetings with the other youth interns and the project manager to discuss findings
- Conduct weekly reporting on youth engagement activities
- Take part in trainings
- Attend monthly partnership meetings

Essential qualifications:

- Be a youth aged 16 − 24
- Leadership ability
- Interpersonal and collaboration skills
- Problem solving skills
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team
- Basic report writing ability or willingness to learn
- Knowledge of barriers facing northern youth

Desired Knowledge and Skills:

- Have lived experience with the school system (high school, independent learning, postsecondary, etc.)
- Understanding of Yukon First Nation culture and history

- Experience working with peers and community
- Ability to communicate in more than one language an asset
- Ability to build meaningful relationships with others

Preference: While we welcome all applicants to apply, given the context in which BYTE works, preference will be given to applicants from Northern communities and/or Indigenous communities.
