

Why we do this:


- Acknowledging the land is a starting place for change

- 35% of elementary school students miss more than one month of school a year
- 3rd highest poverty rate in Canada








BRIDGE BETWEEN ABSTRACT AND CONCRETE



- Allow students to express themselves in ways that they feel comfortable








