## The Building Youth Futures Initiave

Building Youth Futures is a 4-year national initiative funded by the Government of Canada supporting youth age 14-29 graduate from high school, and successfully transition to post-secondary education and/or employment.

## On Education

youth feel intense pressure to "do good" at school, but struggle with the structure of school, feel misunderstood, and need a more interactive learning environment.

## **Real Barriers**

youth recognize that there are programs and activities for youth in CK – but, youth feel powerless to voice their wants/needs, and they face access barriers, such as transportation and waitlists.

## Youth Can Explore Employment Options

- Employment preparation programs are accessible, coordinated, and expanded.
- Youth can identify, explore, and develop multiple employment pathways.
- Mentorship opportunities exist to help youth discover and shape their education & employment pathways.
- Youth have opportunities for gainful & meaningful employment.

#### Supports & Services are Proactive & Impactful

- Services and supports are known by and accessible to youth.
- Youth have opportunities to actively participate in and develop community services & their treatment.
- Agencies provide linked, coordinated, and streamlined services.
- There is authentic youth participation & engagement on community committees & tables.
- Services are available to prevent youth entering into crisis.

## Education is Engaging & Accessible

- High school is a supportive environment where all youth can thrive.
- Varied education & training pathways are valued.
- Youth graduation rates are above provincial and national average.
- Youth have access to education and training programs without incurring debt.
- Youth are prepared to transition to employment.

## **Being Accepted & Connected**

- Youth are celebrated, seen as a positive part of the community, and valued as decision makers.
- Youth have access to meaningful volunteerism and affordable social/recreation activities, especially for younger youth.
- Youth feel connected to each other, their family, neighbourhood, and community.

#### Our Community's Role in **Collective** Impact

Building Youth Futures is a collective impact initiative, meaning we work across sectors with multiple partners (currently 30+) working together to achieve a shared vision.
