# Portage la Prairie Communities Building Youth Futures Plan 2020-2024



## Graduation 🛱

Less students graduated high school in Portage (72.5%\*) than in Manitoba overall (85.1%\*) in 2019.

In Manitoba, indigenous students graduated on-time less often (50.7%) than non-indigenous students (89.9%) in 2019.

### College, University, Trades



Less than half  $(41.7\%)^*$  of people in Portage have finished college, university or trades programs.

This is lower than in Manitoba overall (62%) and Canada (70%).

## Unemployment 个

The amount of people living in Portage who do not work (4.3%) seems to be getting higher\*\*

based on five-year student-tracked high school graduation rates. "from the 2016 census.
