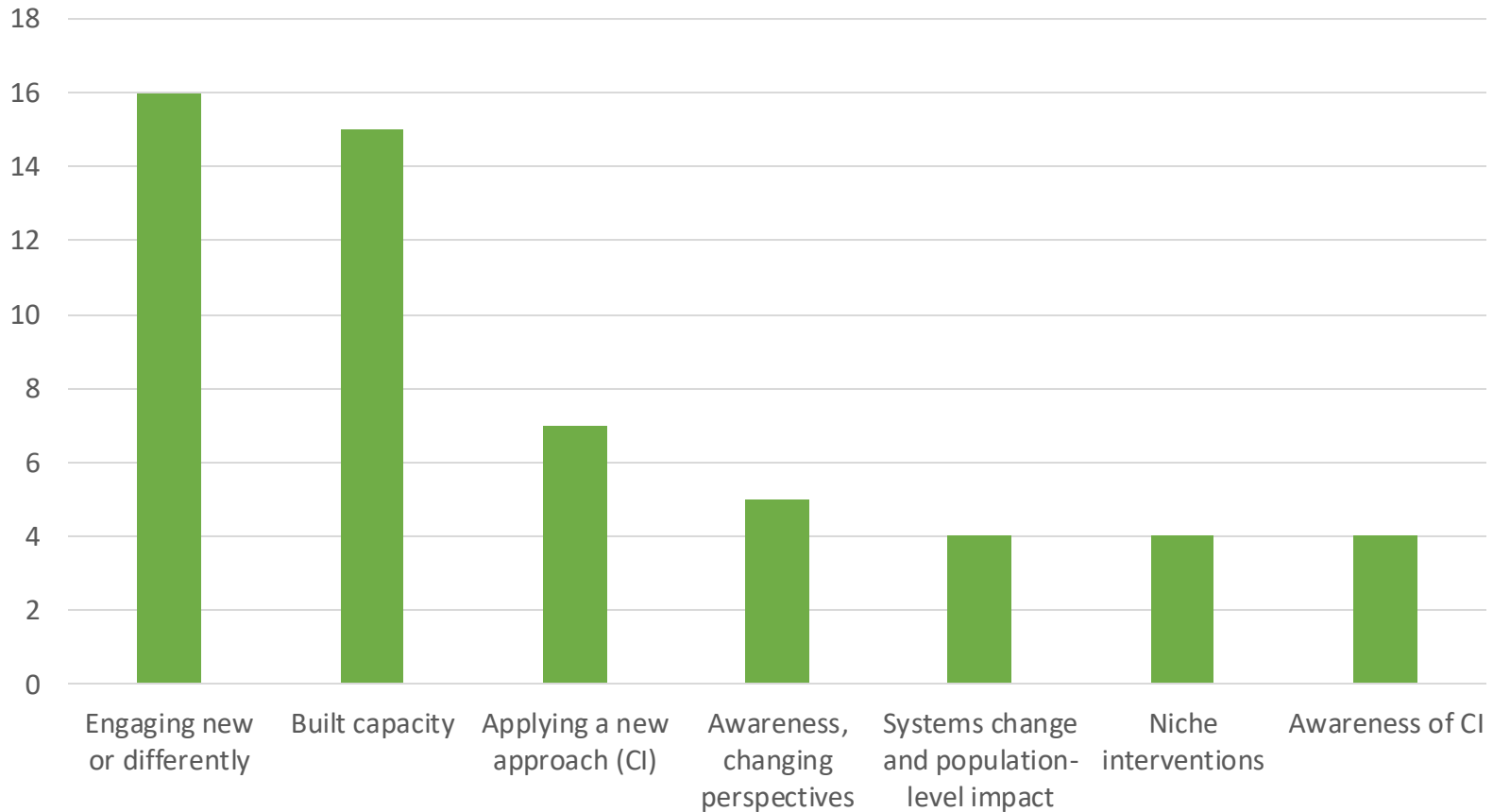

## Observed Outcomes: Municipalities Taking Leadership Roles





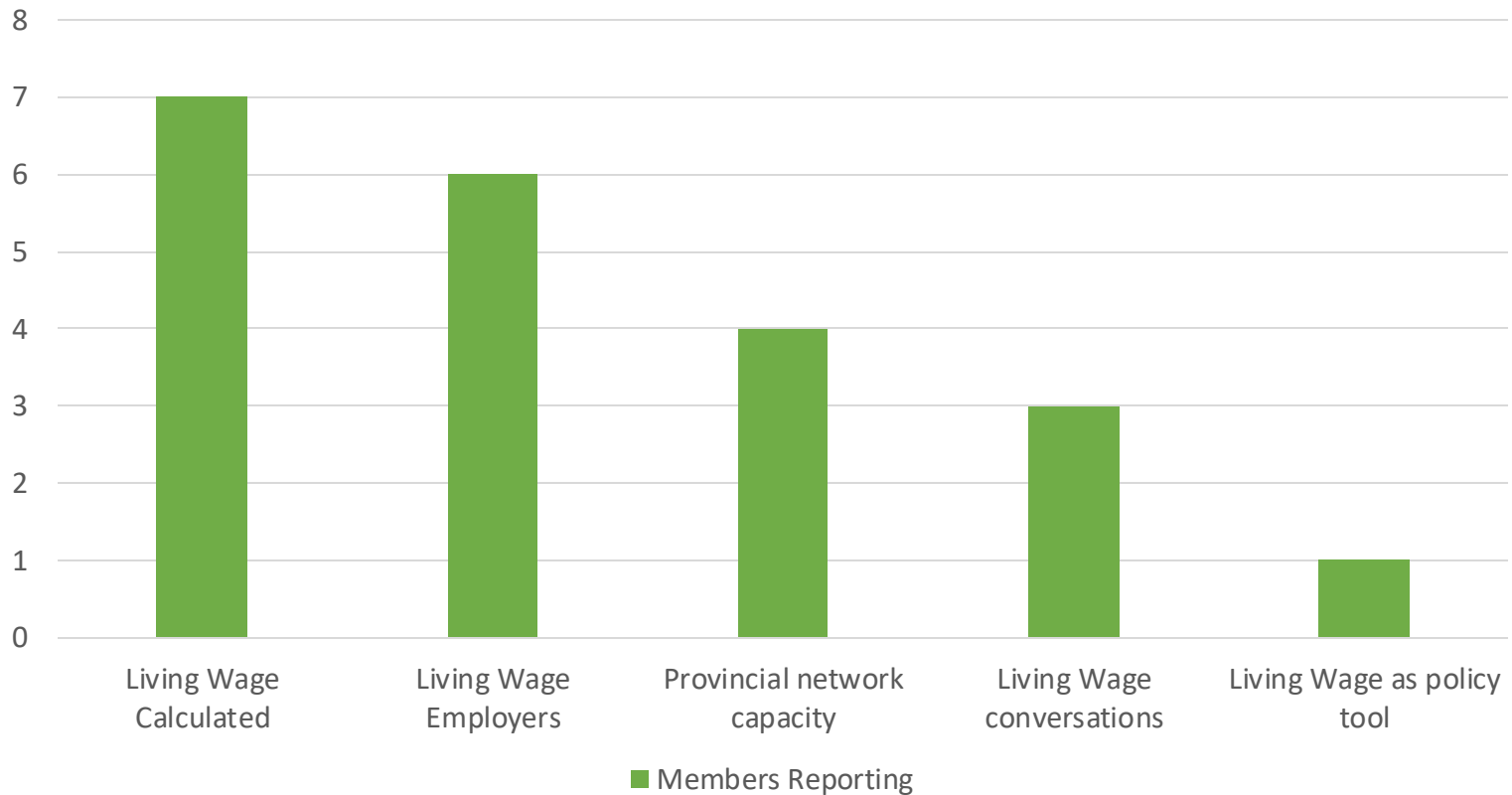

**Observed Outcomes: Increases in Engaging with People with Lived/Living Experience**

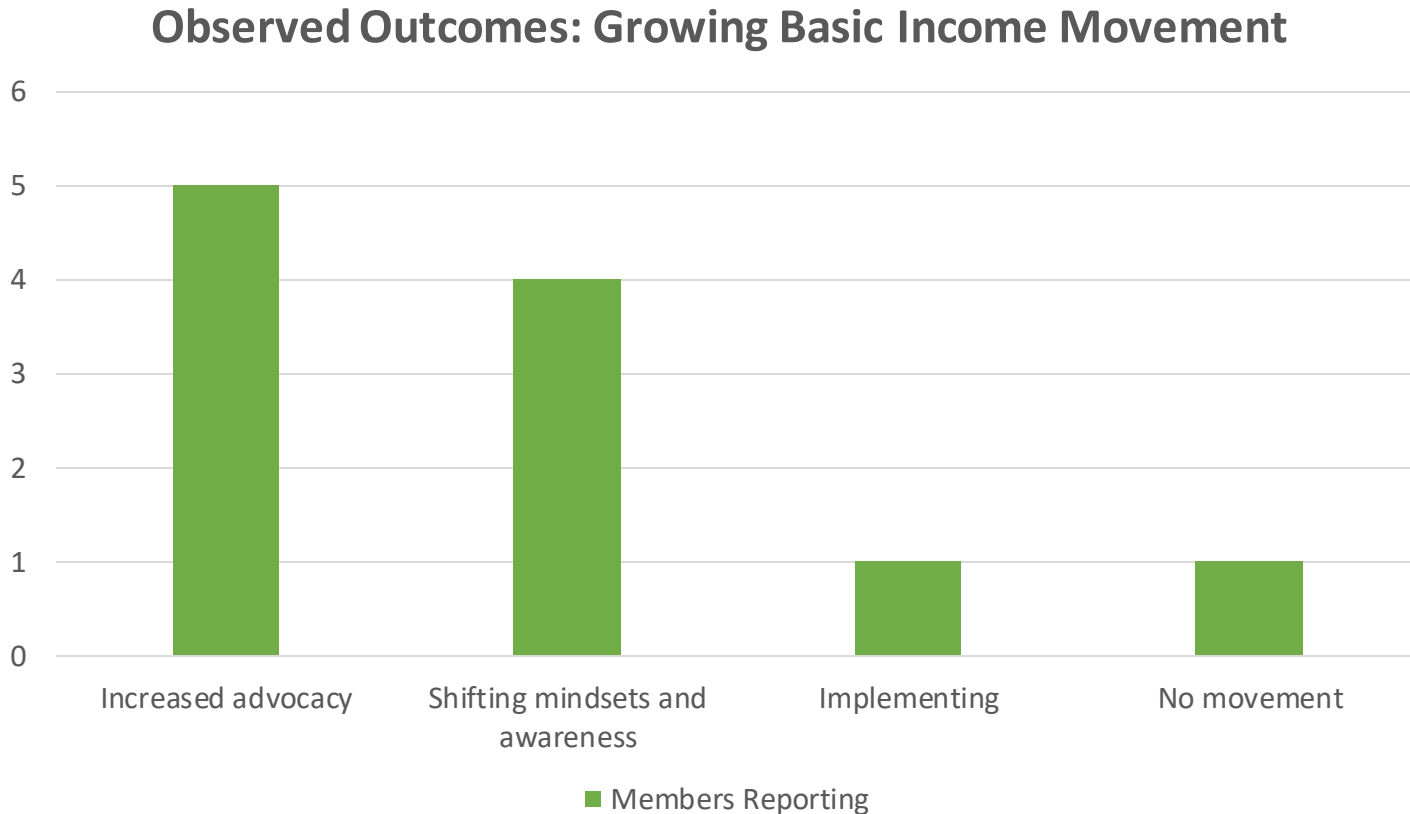

## Observed Outcomes: Increasing Wages

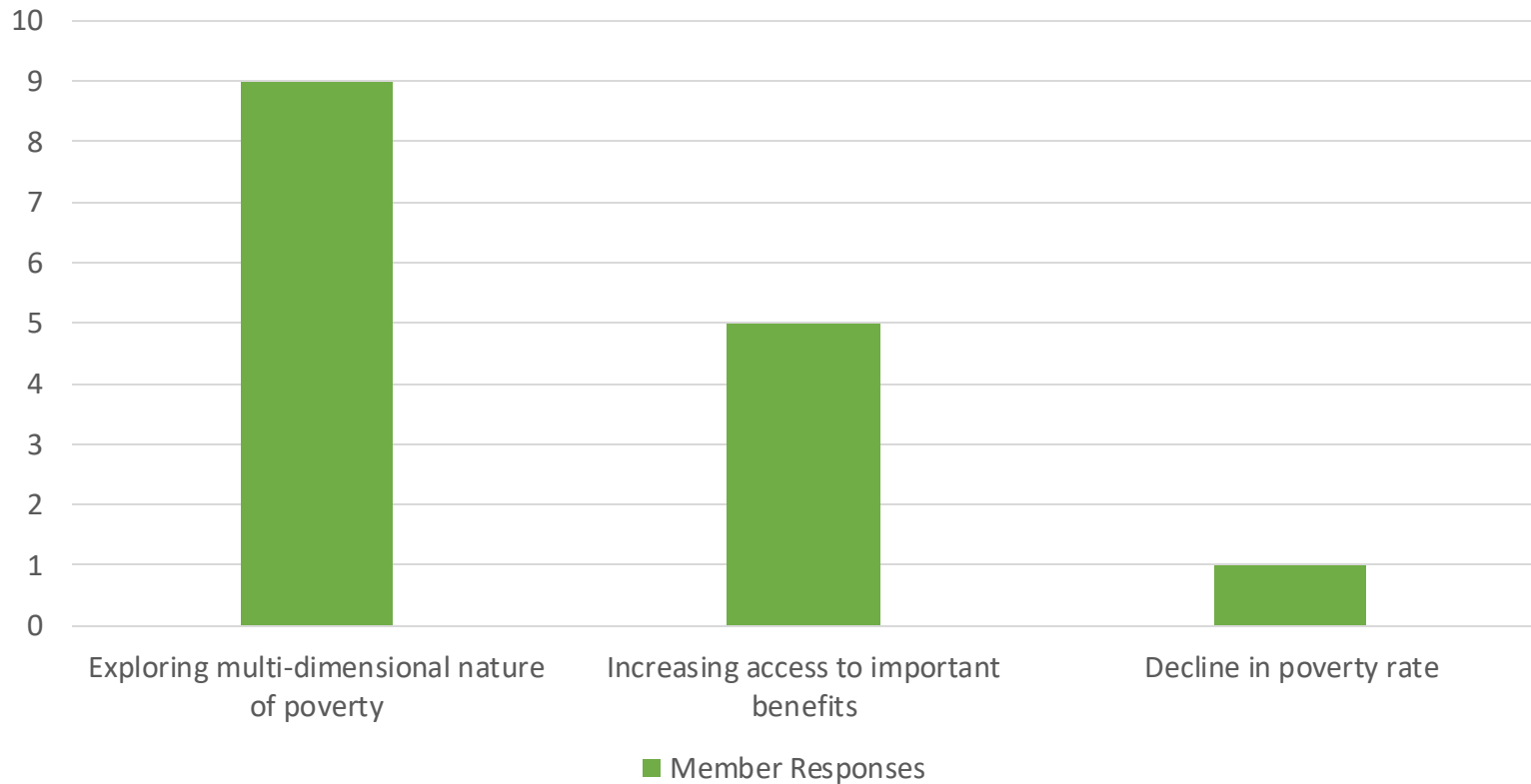

# 2022 CEP Virtual Member Gathering

- **Sustainability** includes leadership, funding, community engagement, and the ability to influence policy & systems.
- **Resilience** is "collaborative" well-being, including efforts to increase capacity, bounce back from setbacks, mobilize emerging opportunities, take time to reflect, and prepare for future challenges.

# 2022 CEP Virtual Member Gathering

- Sustainability is achieved when there is sufficient human, cultural and social assets invested in the collective effort.
- The most important part of sustainability and resilience is being intentional about reflecting on and addressing them within your collaborative's context.
- They require investing time in defining what they mean to you and creating action plans that nurture and manage the elements or qualities that contribute to them
