Setting the Context







About St. Albert

- NW of Edmonton, Alberta
- Population of 65,590 (2016)
- 19 residential neighbourhoods
- 1 Neighbourhood Association















Driven by our community!

- Social Master Plan (2013)
 - 600 residents
 - 150 service providers
- 5 values emerged


Neighbourhood Connectors

- Embraced by residents!














St. Albert residents are engaged!

Off the Side of the Desk

- Intuitively we know it's working
- Good intentions to evaluate
- Start asking the questions
- But...no time to analyze or learn from it





Data Galore!

- Block Party Evaluations Since 2008!
- Questions included:
 - Process How was the on-line registration, rec bags, pick-up and drop-off process, food, etc.
 - Outcomes What happened as a result of the party? Did it impact your sense of community, feelings of safety, etc?

- A passion for neighbourhood development meets a passion for evaluation!?










Block Party Analysis – Take one!

- The Number Trap can we show we're having success even if the numbers go down?
- The X Y is close to 1...huh?







What did we learn?

- We're doing something right!
- Block Parties are a valuable tool for ND
- Numbers are growing yearly
- BUT.... not the whole story







Evaluation – Take two!

- Inspired by first evaluation to do more
- Little Free Library stewards and Neighbourhood Connectors surveyed








Ah-ha Moment!


- Path to Neighbourhood Connection

Evaluation illuminates next steps!

- Don't cap Little Free Libraries!
- Recognize the 10 year Block Party streakers
- Build the connection between Neighbourhood Connectors and Neighbourhood Associations
- Enhance evaluations to help measure outcomes – ask better questions!



What have we learned?







We can be friends with Evaluation!

- Evaluation should FEEL right
 - Start where you are
 - What are you already collecting
- Evaluation is NOT separate from the program
 - It is the muscle for the bones!
- Evaluation allows the SHIFT from anecdotal, nice to know, feel good stuff to facts, proof, and necessity.
