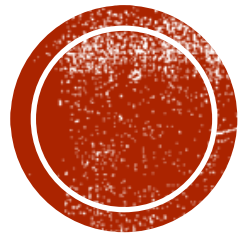

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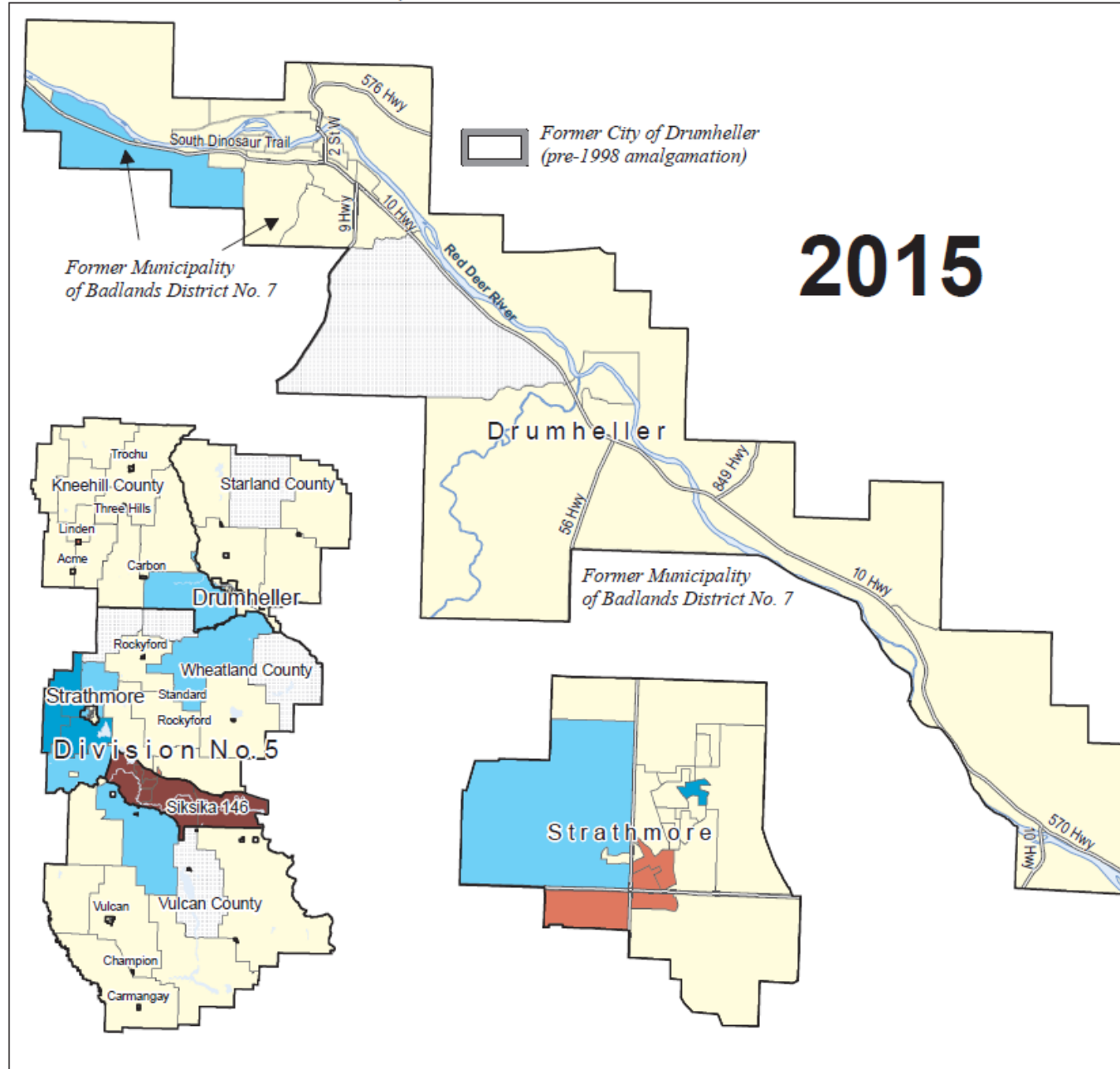

Dissemination Area Average Individual Income compared to the Division No. 5 Average of \$48,793

- Very High - 140% to 145% (4 DAs, 5% of the region)
- High - 120% to 140% (7 DAs, 8% of the region)
- Middle Income - 80% to 120% (62 DAs, 71% of the region)
- Low - 60% to 80% (9 DAs, 10% of the region)
- Very Low - 41% to 60% (5 DAs, 6% of the region)
- Not Available (24 DAs)

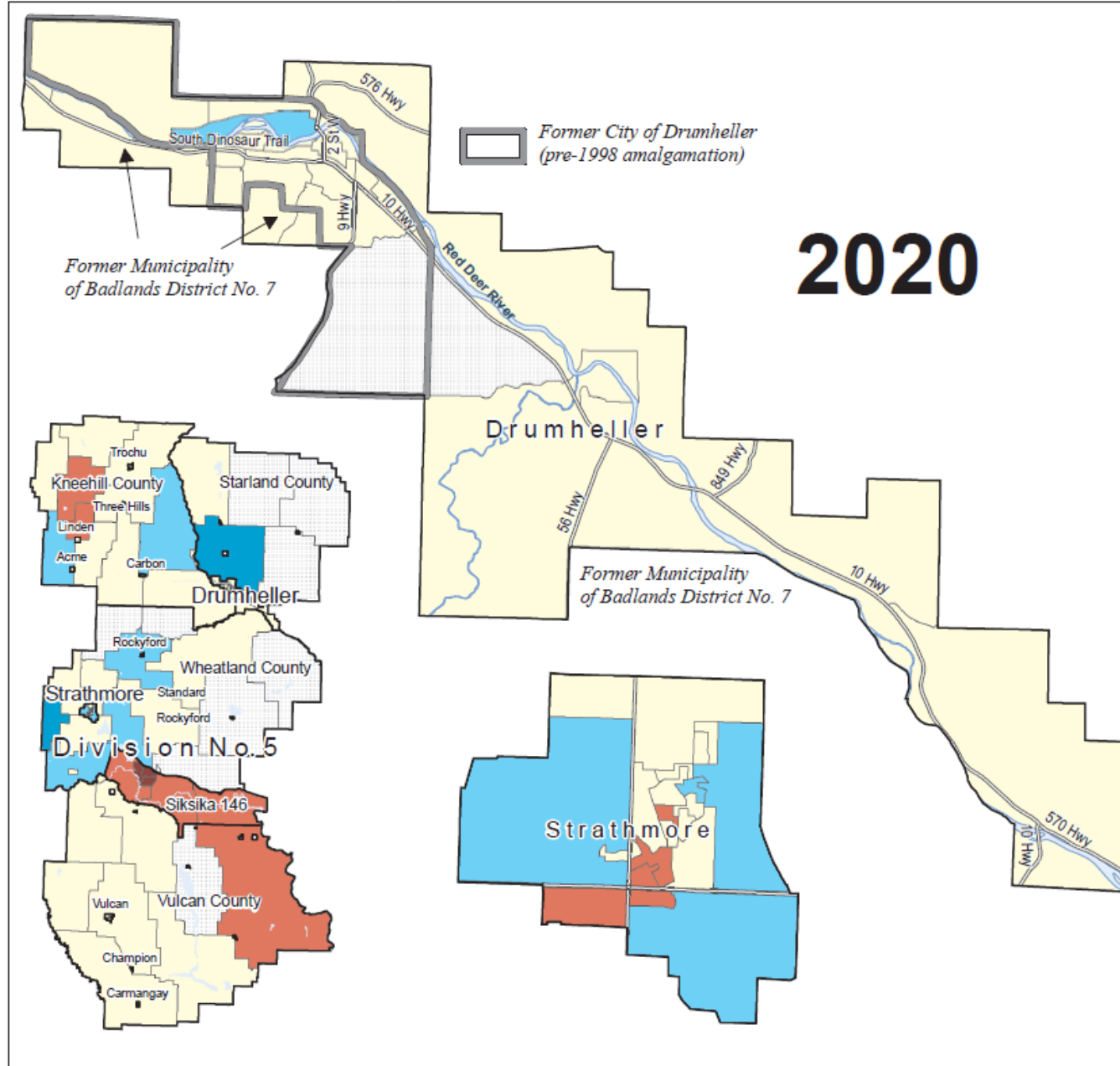

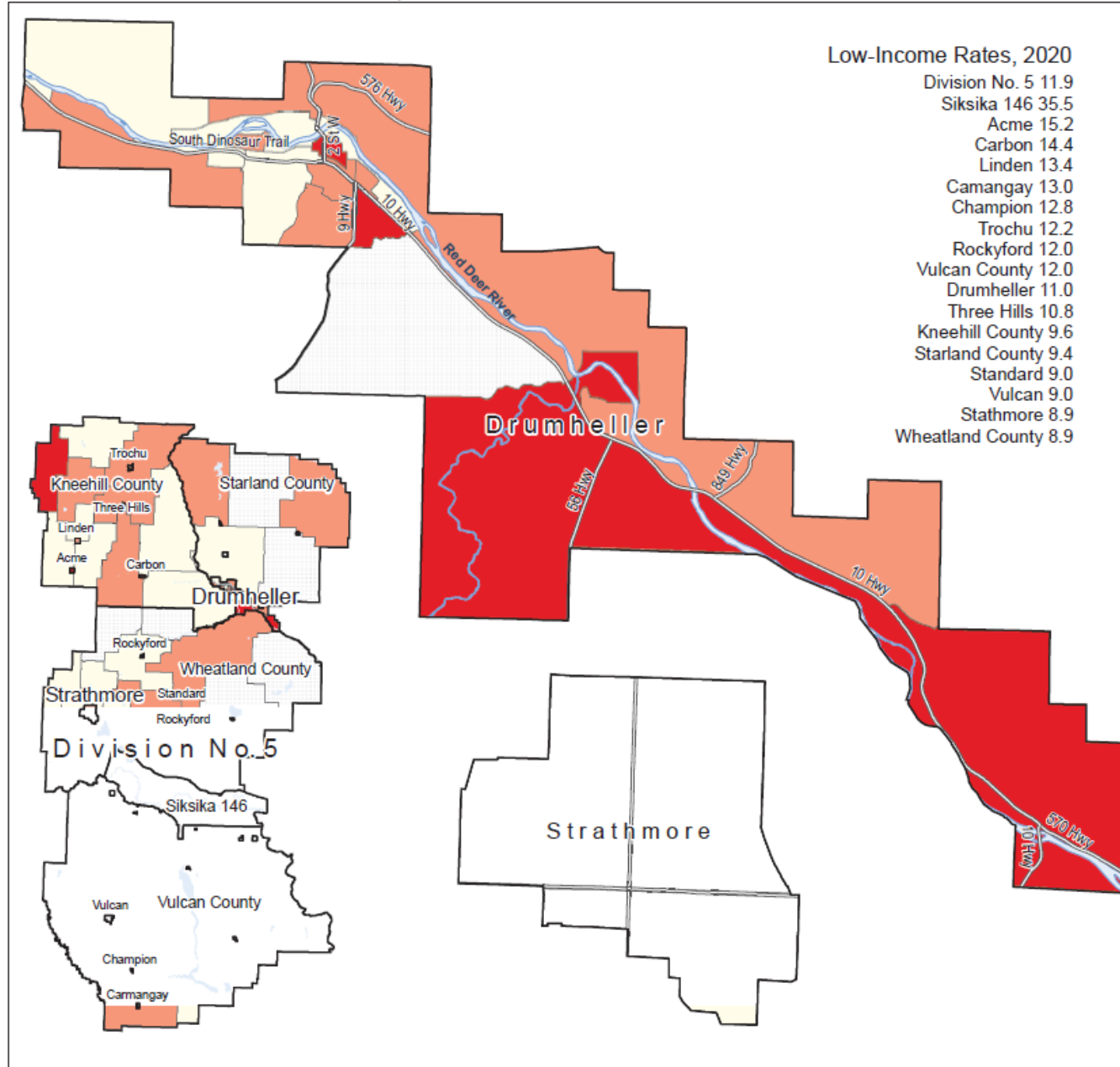

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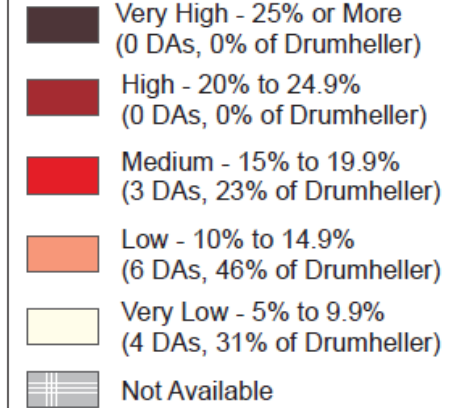


Low-Income Population, After-Tax Income, 2020

Dissemination Area Population Percent Below the Low-Income Measure After-Tax (LIM-AT)



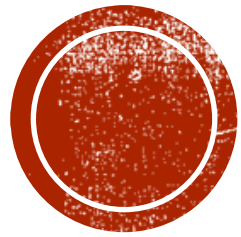

This adjustment for different household sizes reflects the fact that a household's needs increase, but at a decreasing rate, as the number of members increases.

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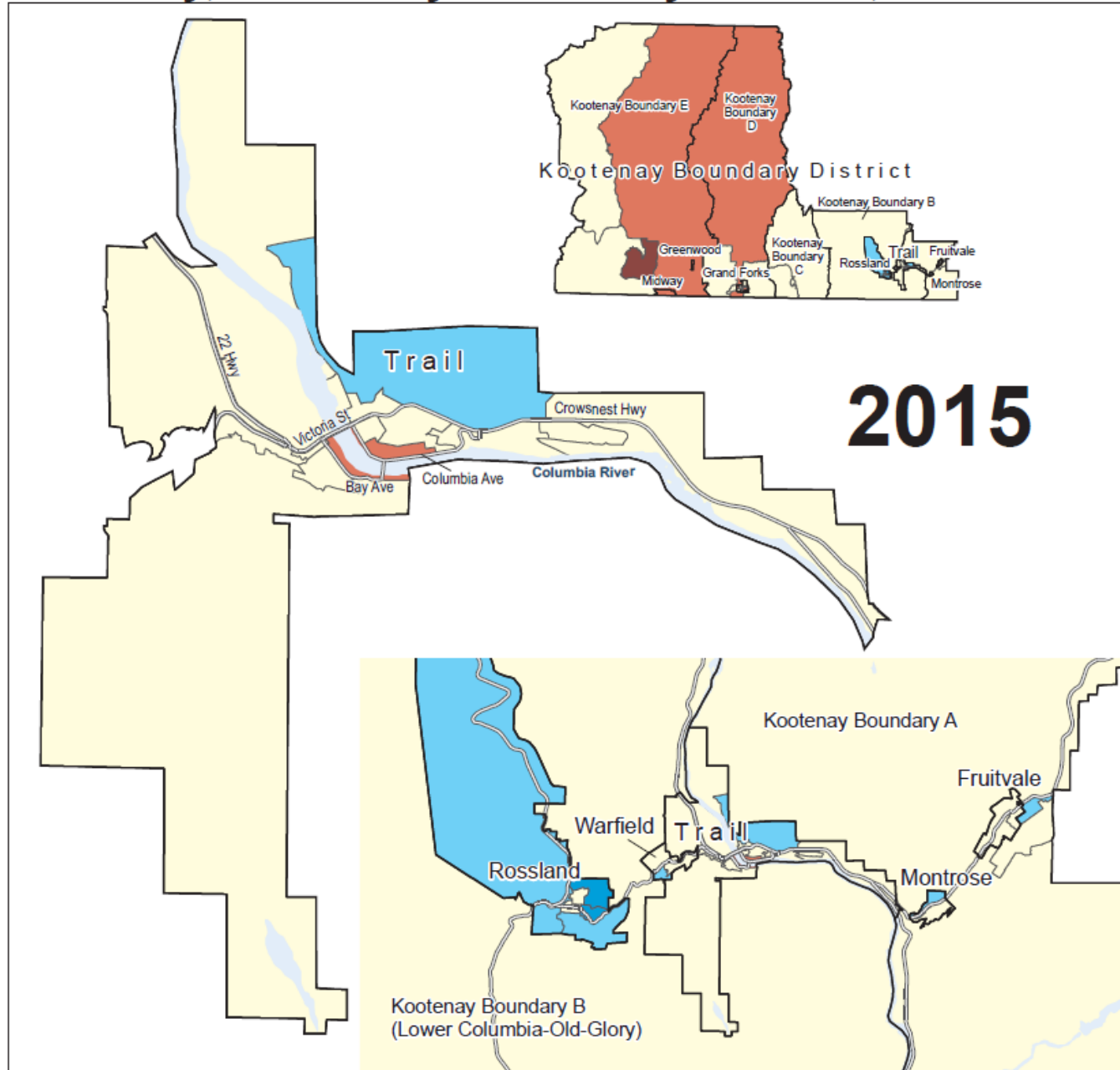

- Very Low - Less than 60% (1 DAs, 2% of the region)

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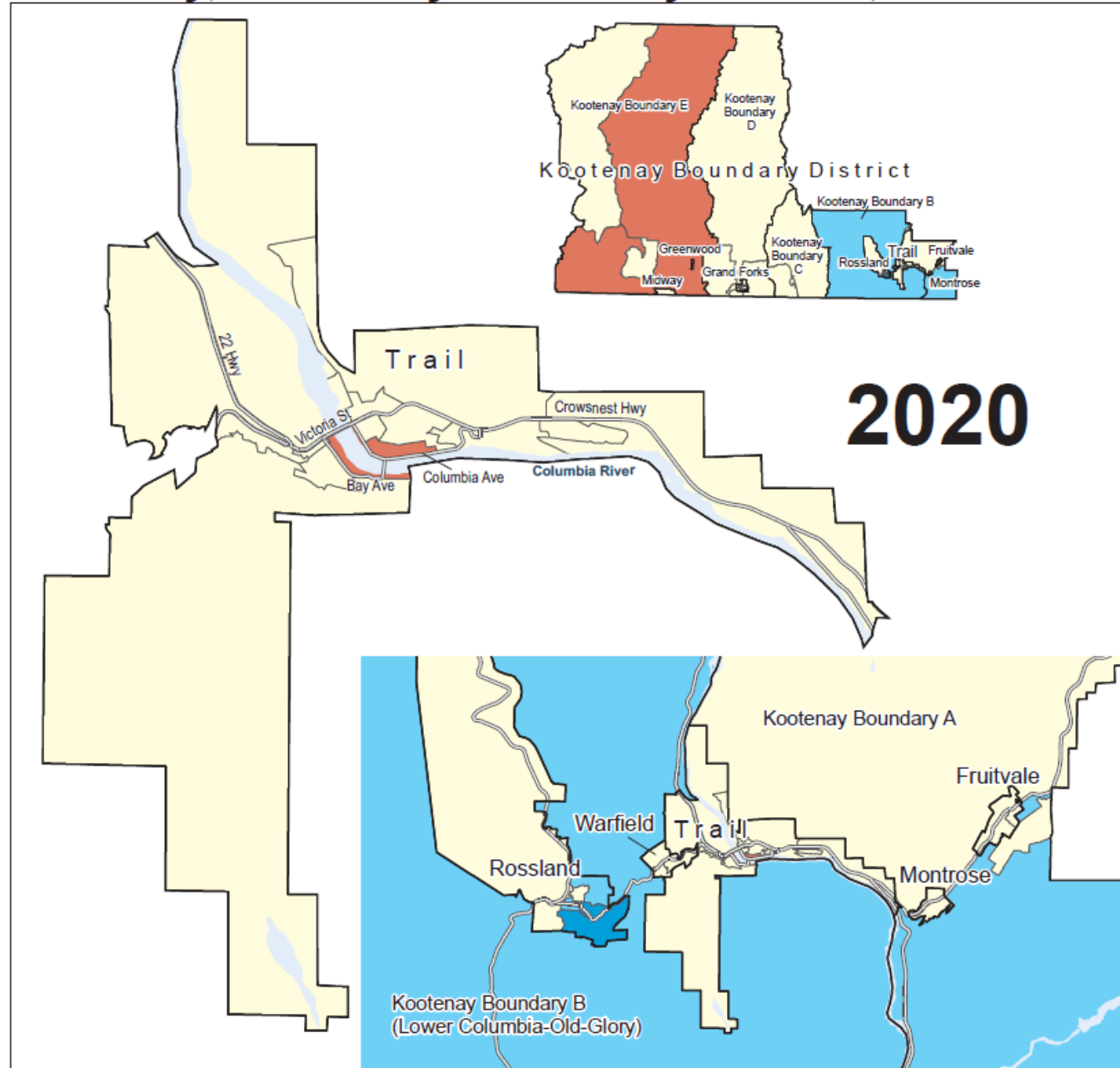

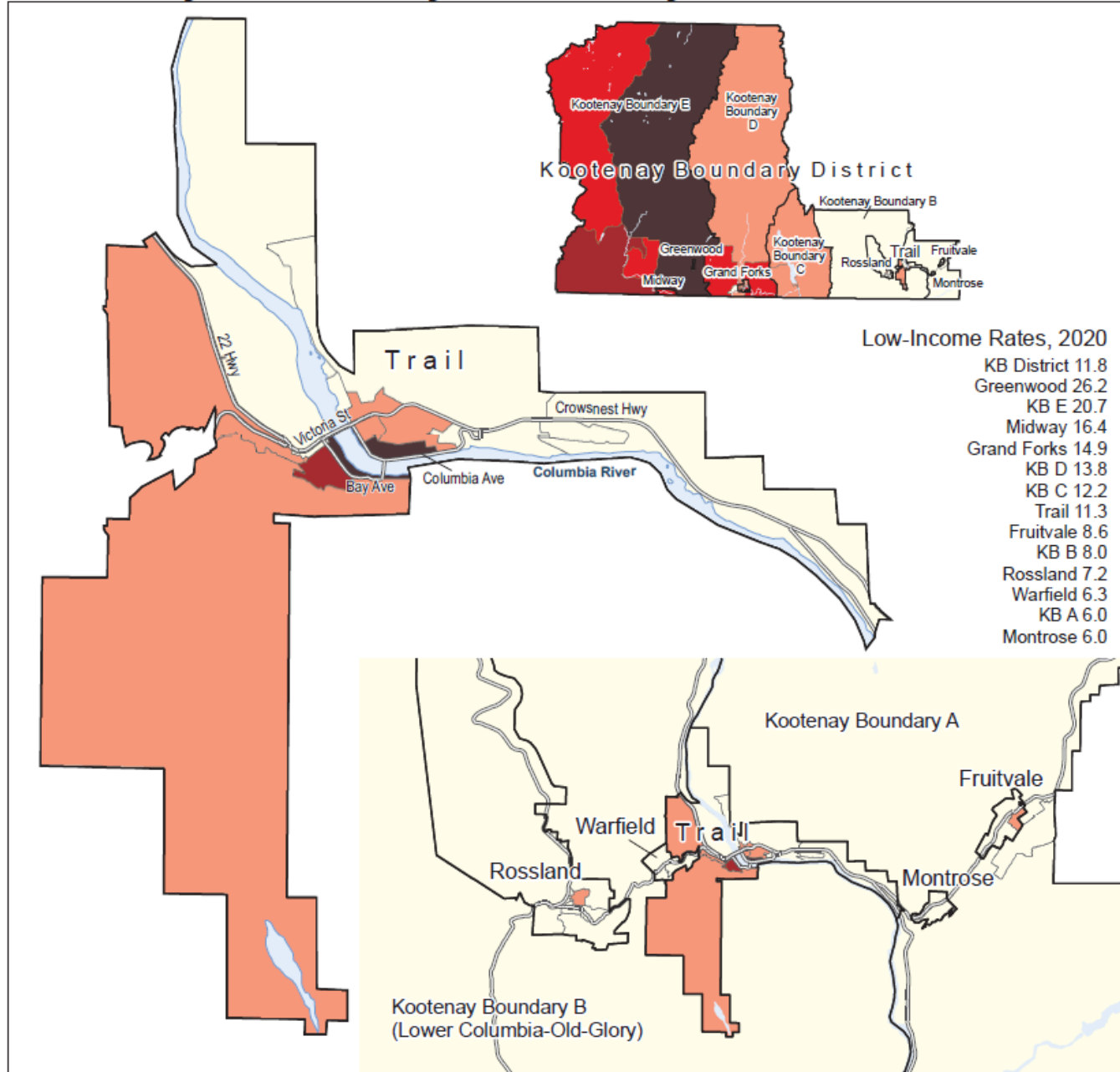

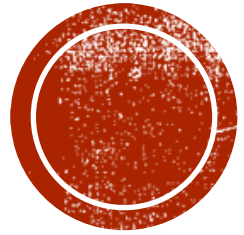

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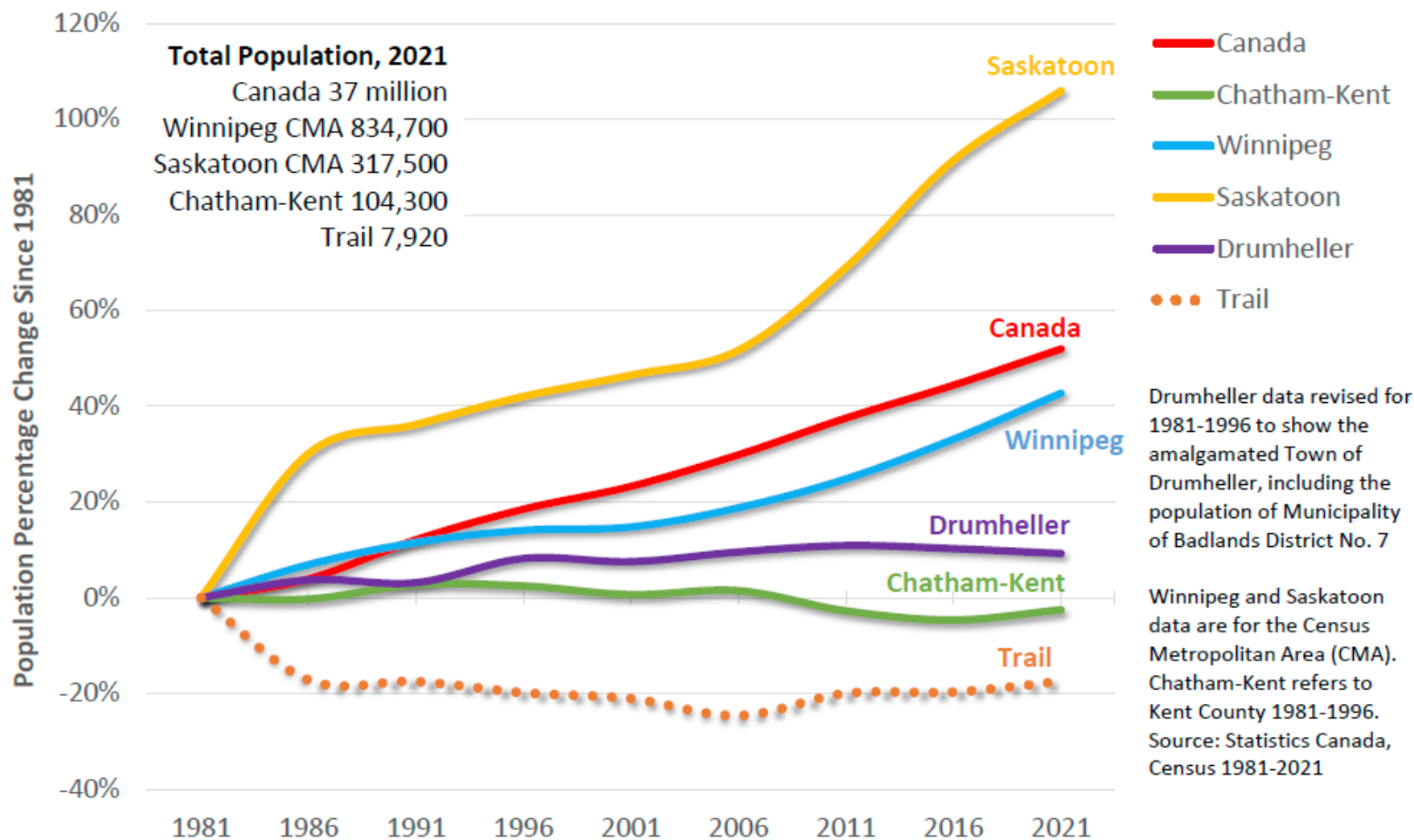

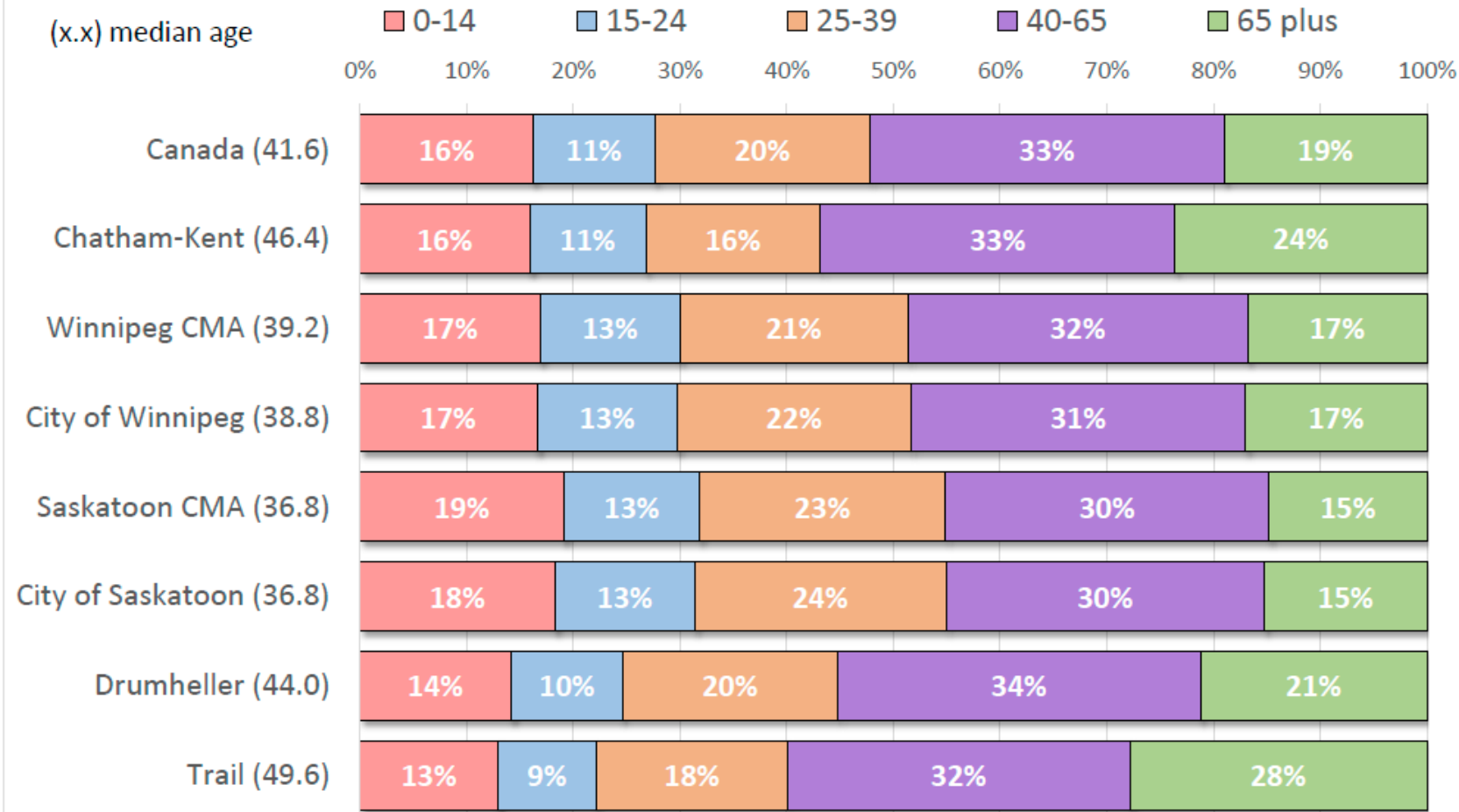
Population Growth Rates, 1981–2021

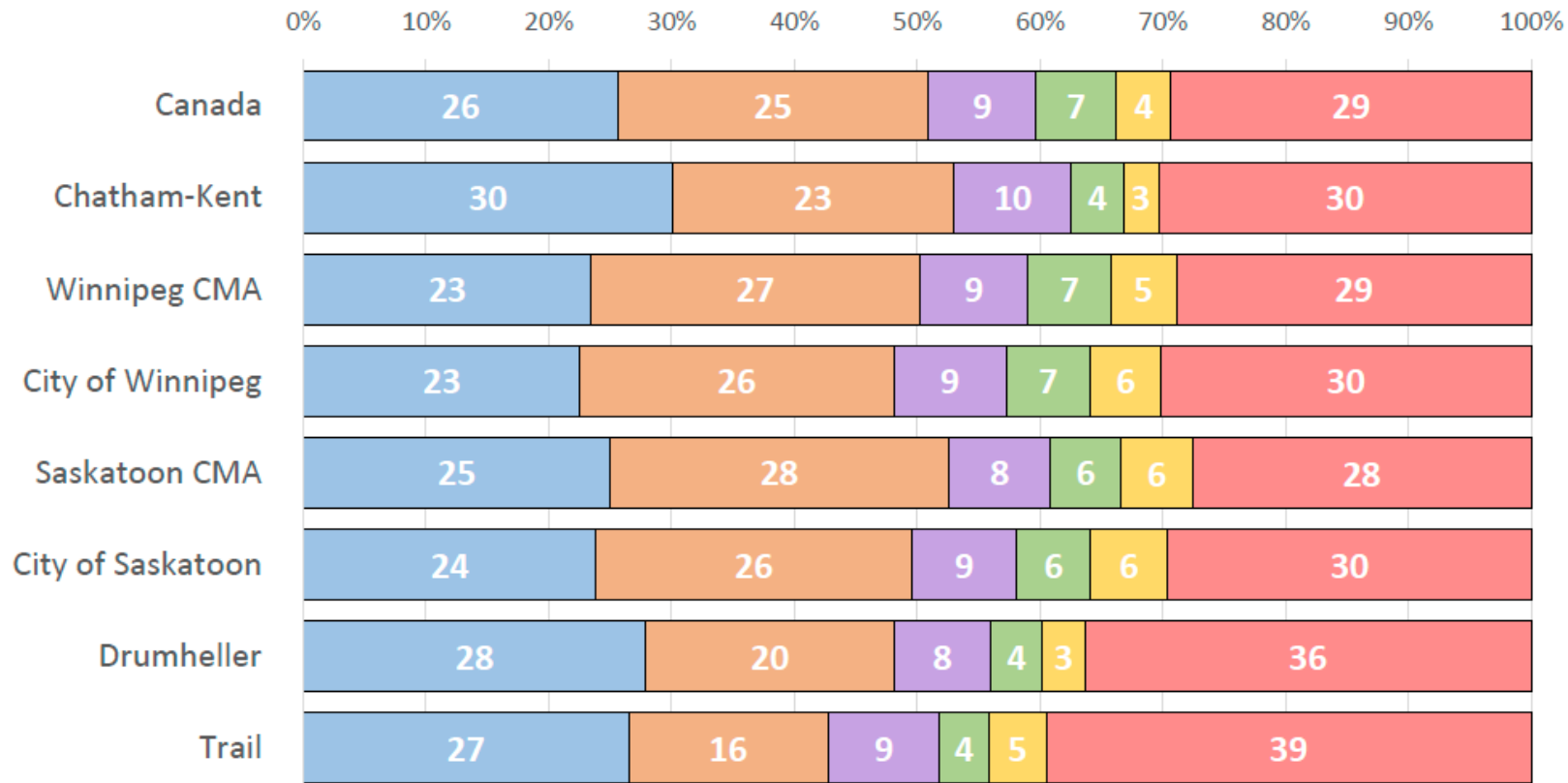

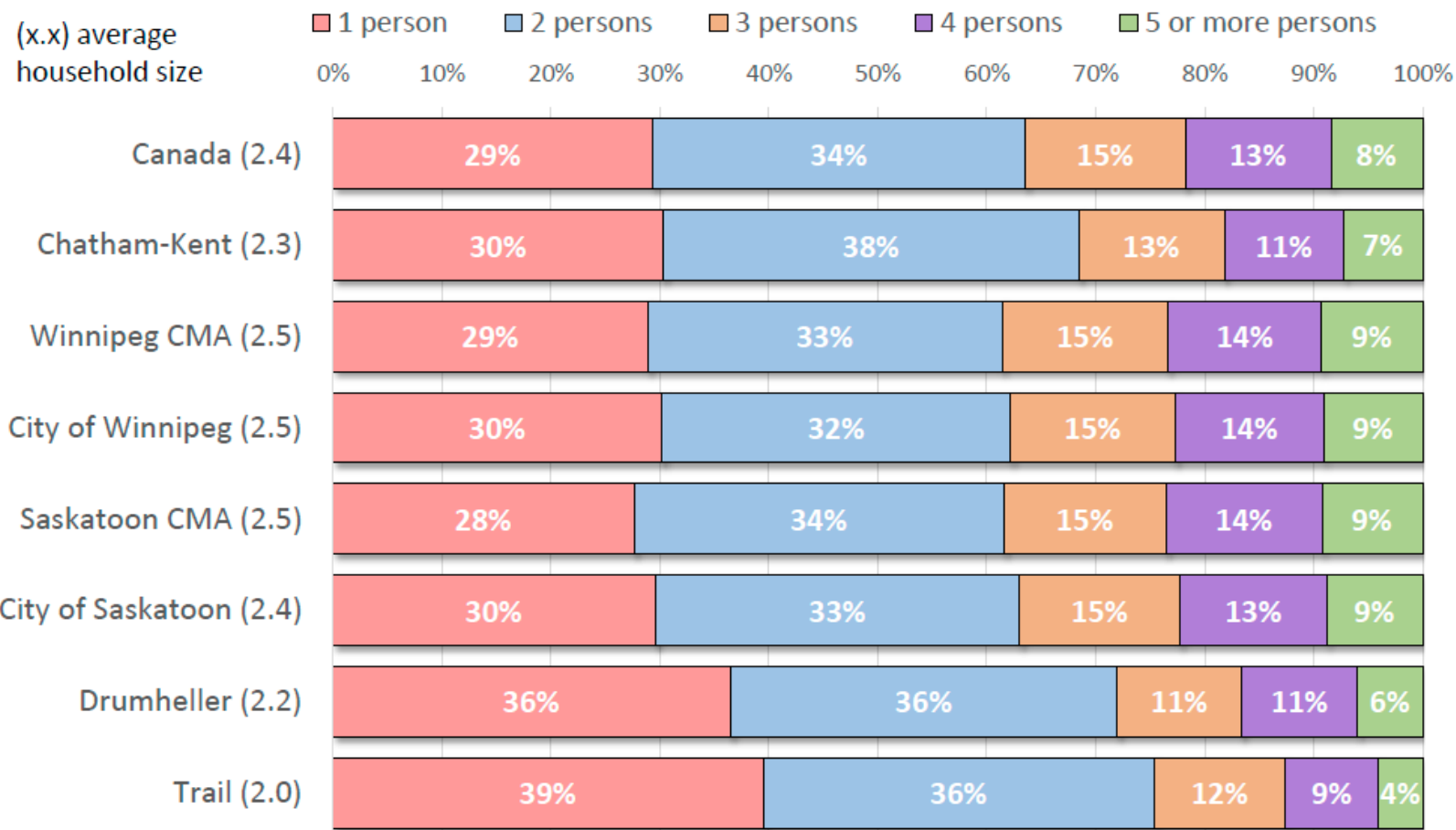

Household Size Distribution, 2021

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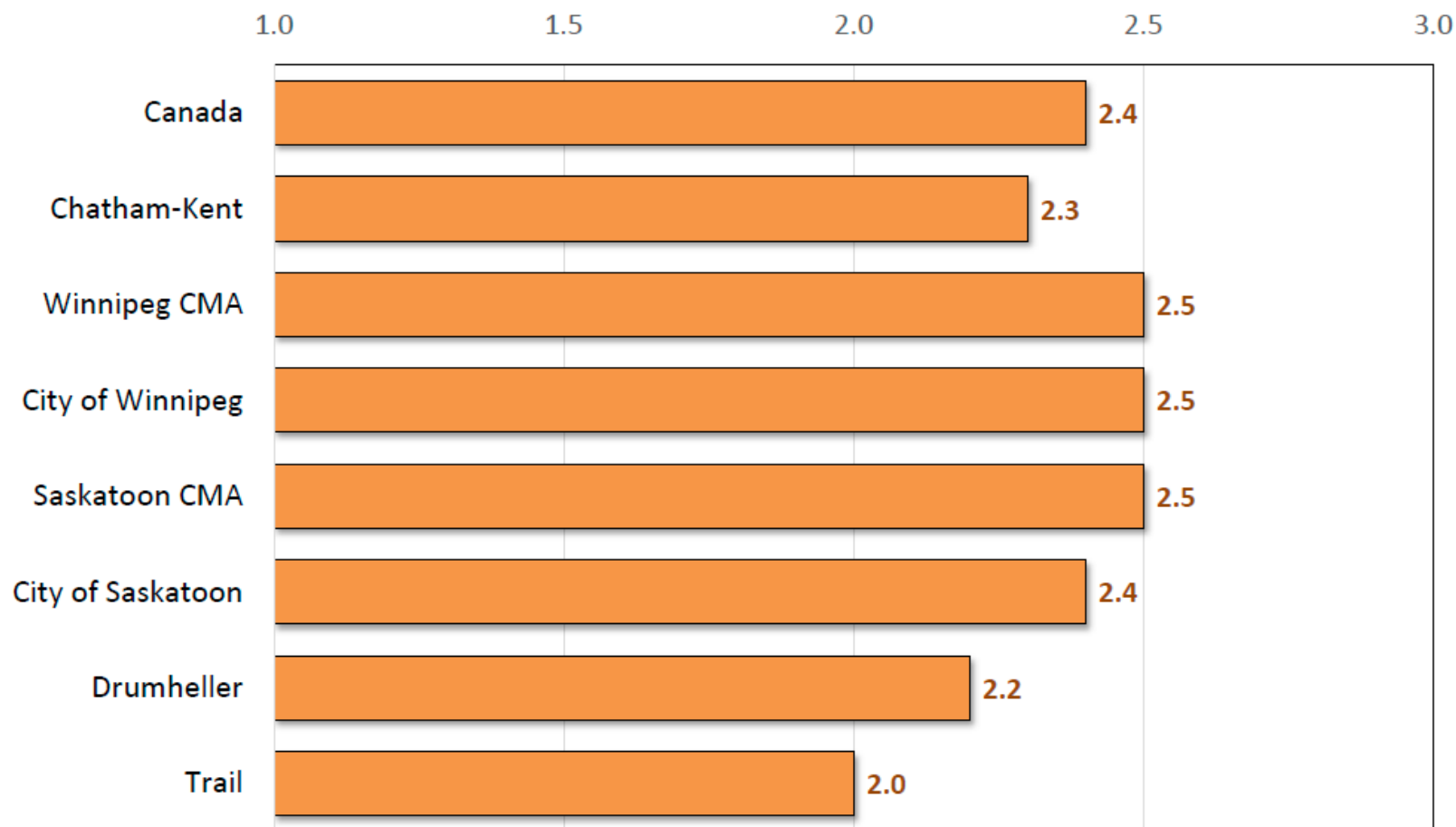

Average Household Size, 2021

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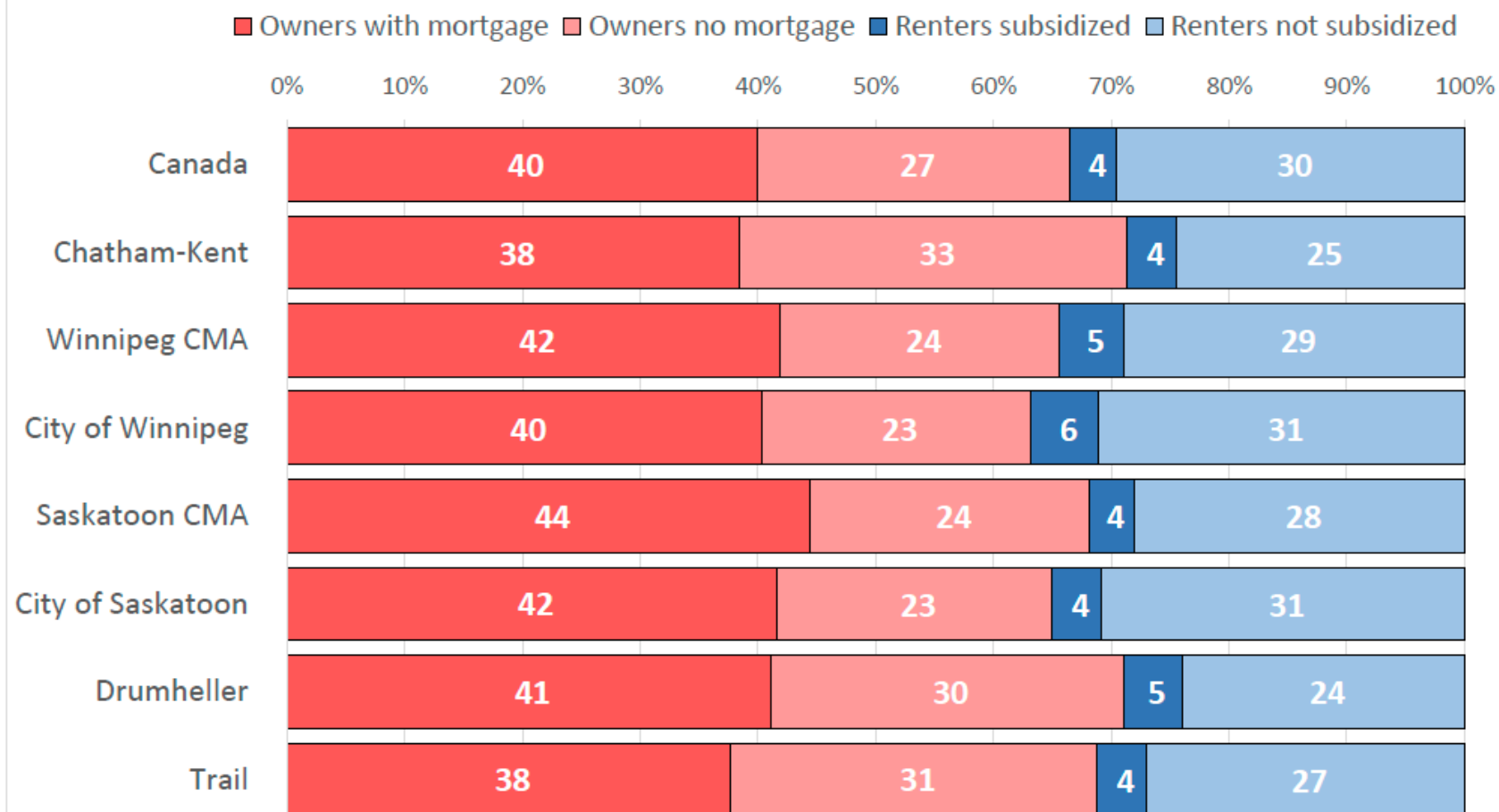

Households by Mortgage and Rent Subsidy Status, 2021

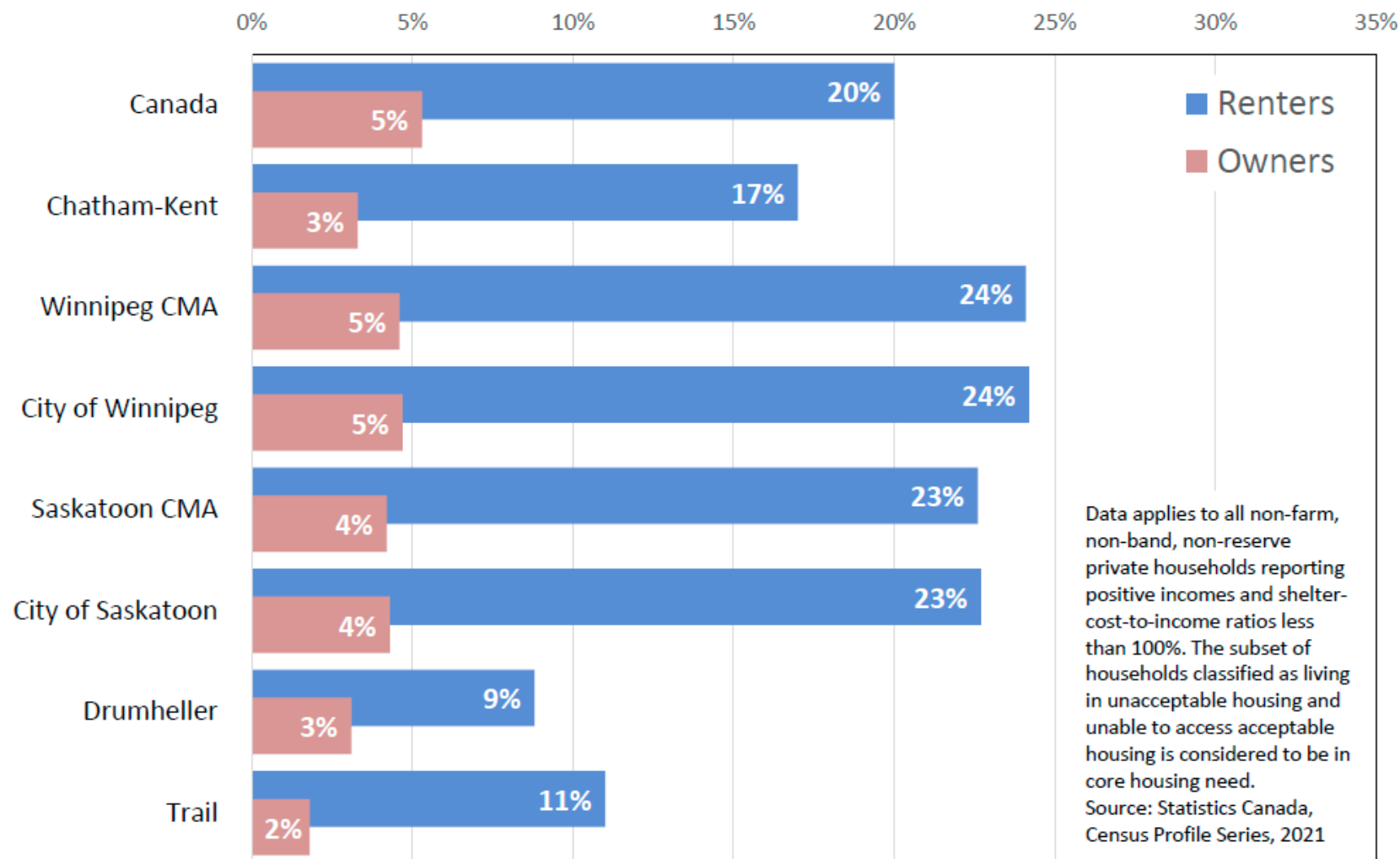

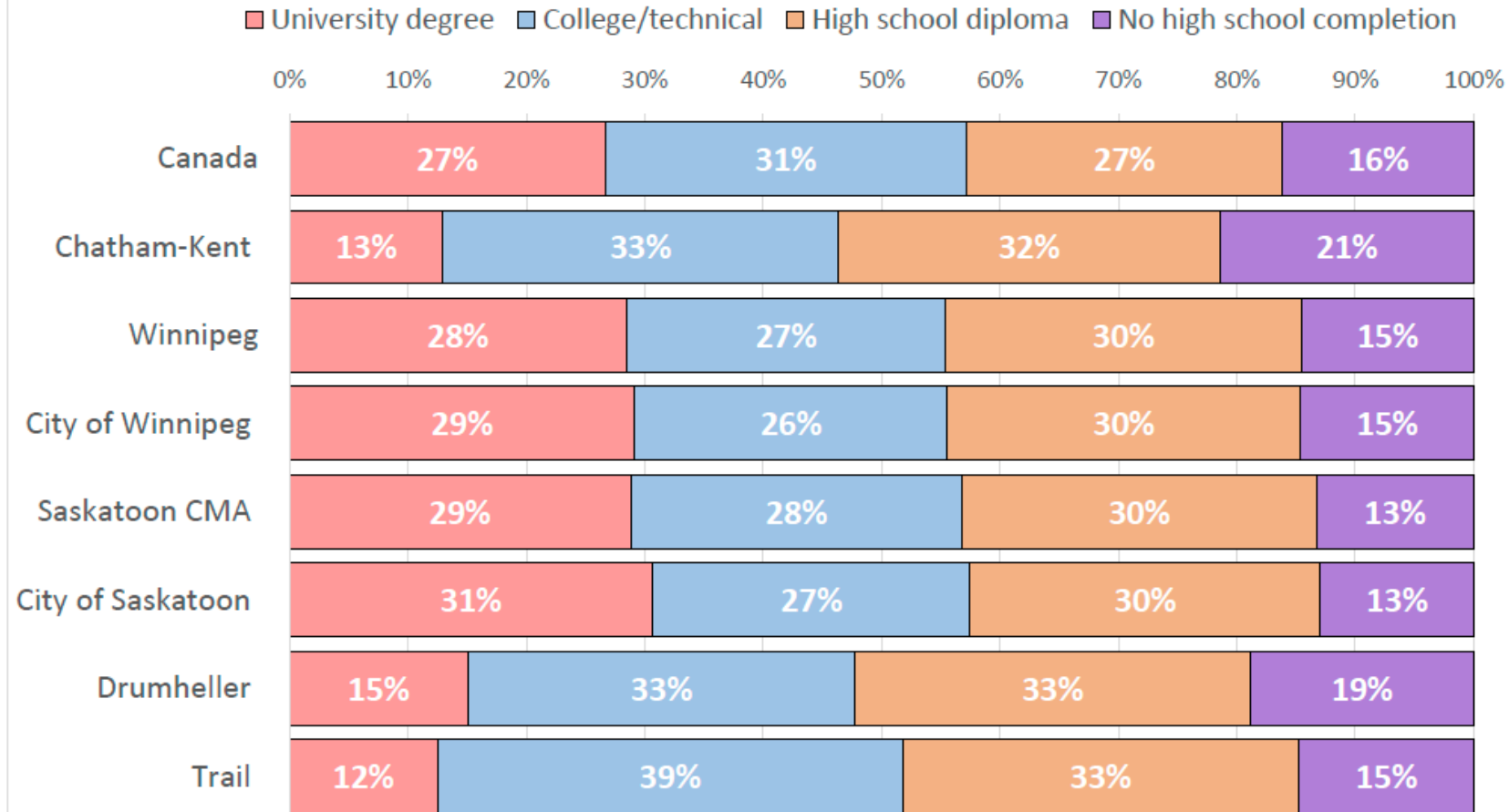


Incidence of Households in Core Housing Need by Tenure Canada and the Five Tamarack Study Areas, 2021

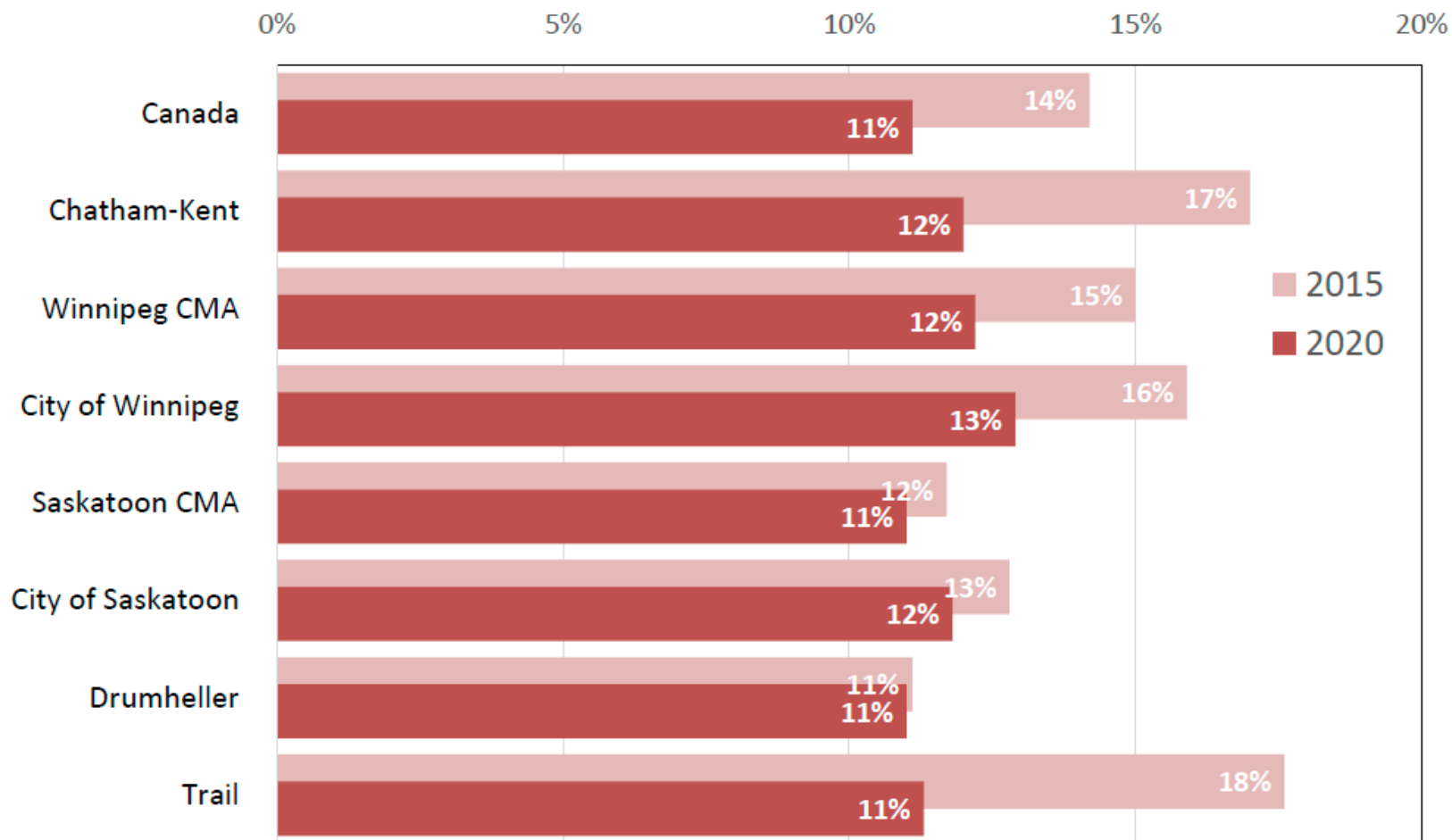

Low Income Rates After-Tax (LIM-AT), 2015 and 2020

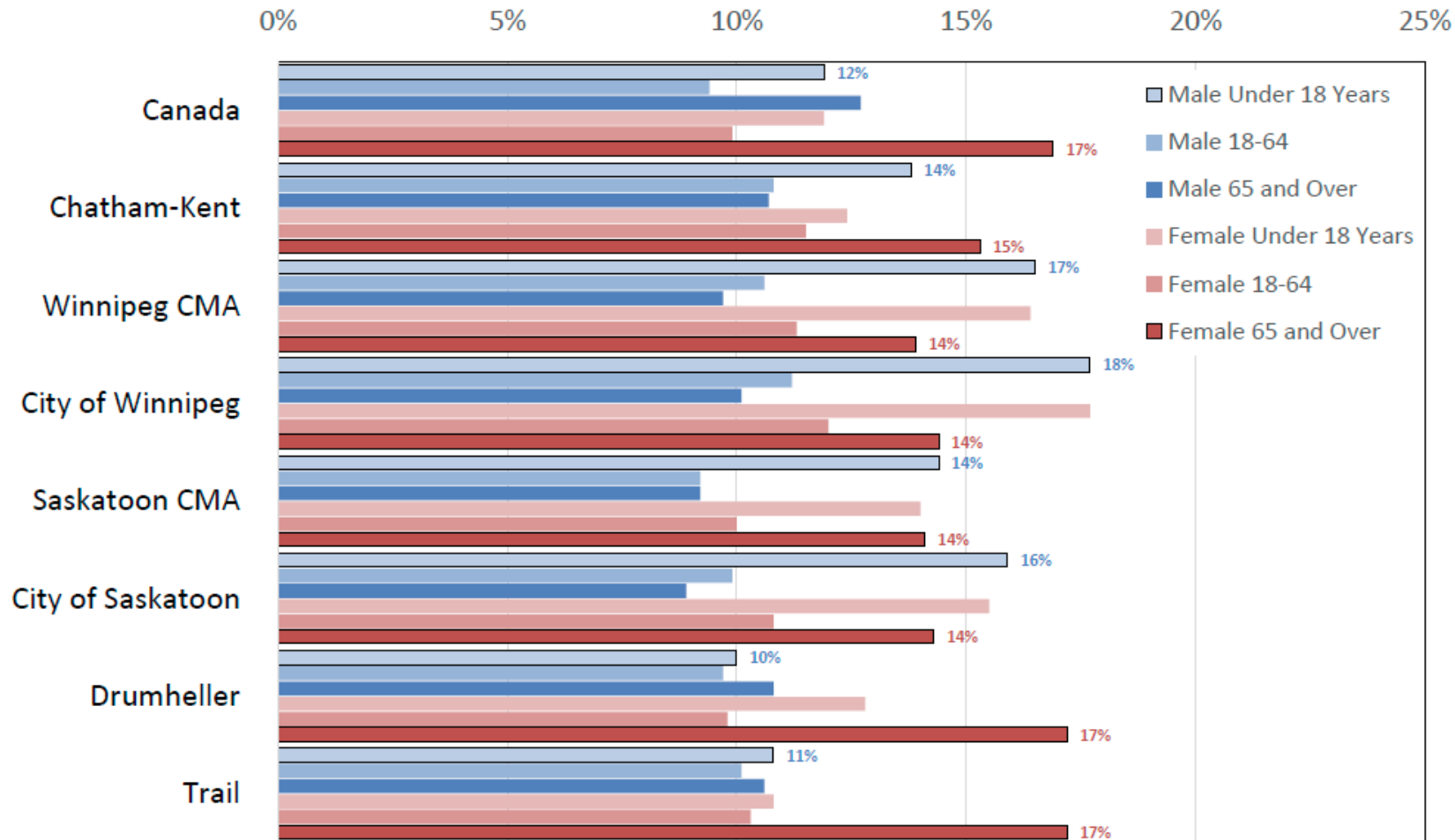

Low Income Rates After-Tax by Sex and Age Group (LIM-AT) Canada and the Five Tamarack Study Areas, 2020

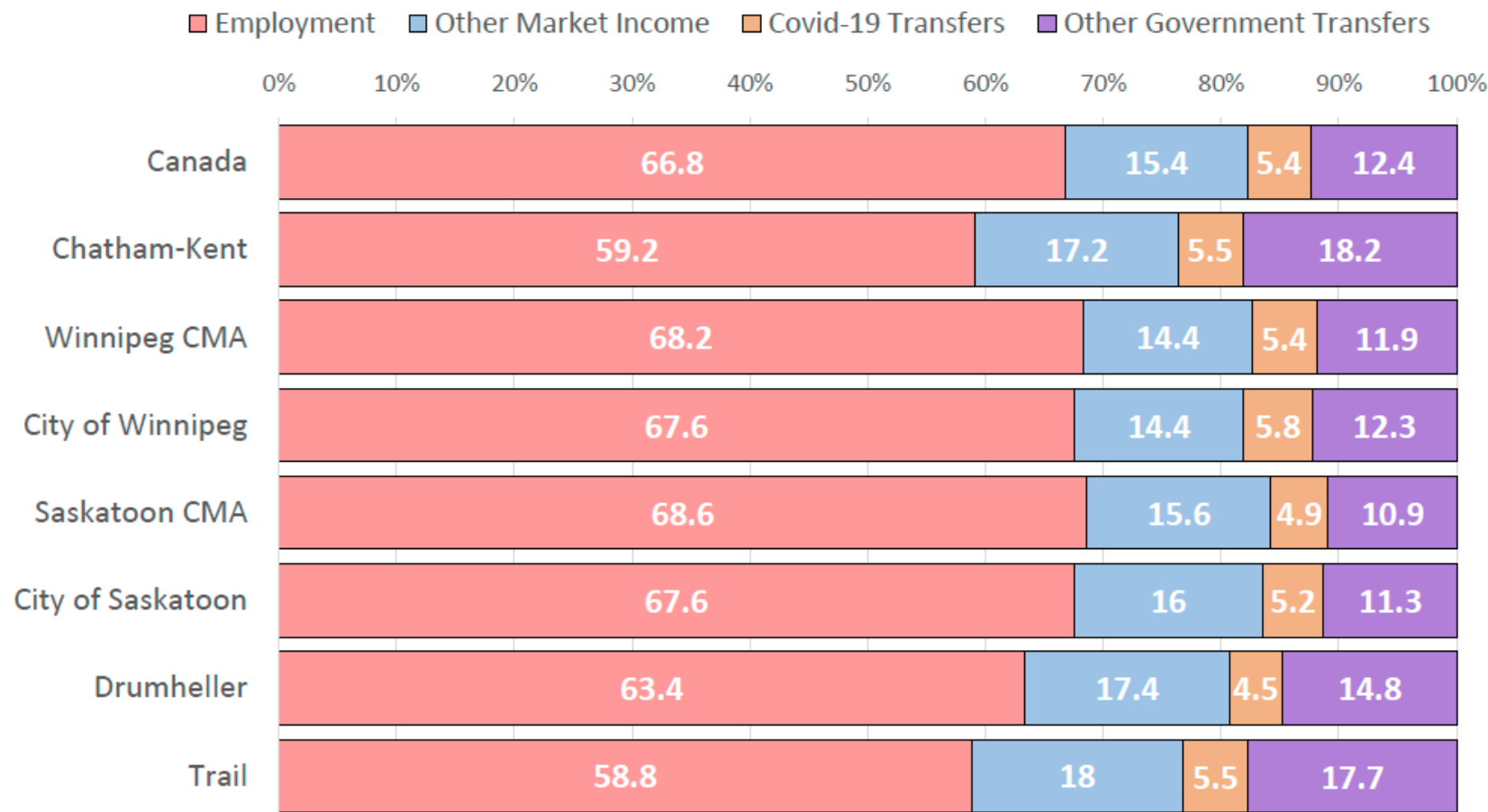

Income Sources by Share of Total Income, 2020

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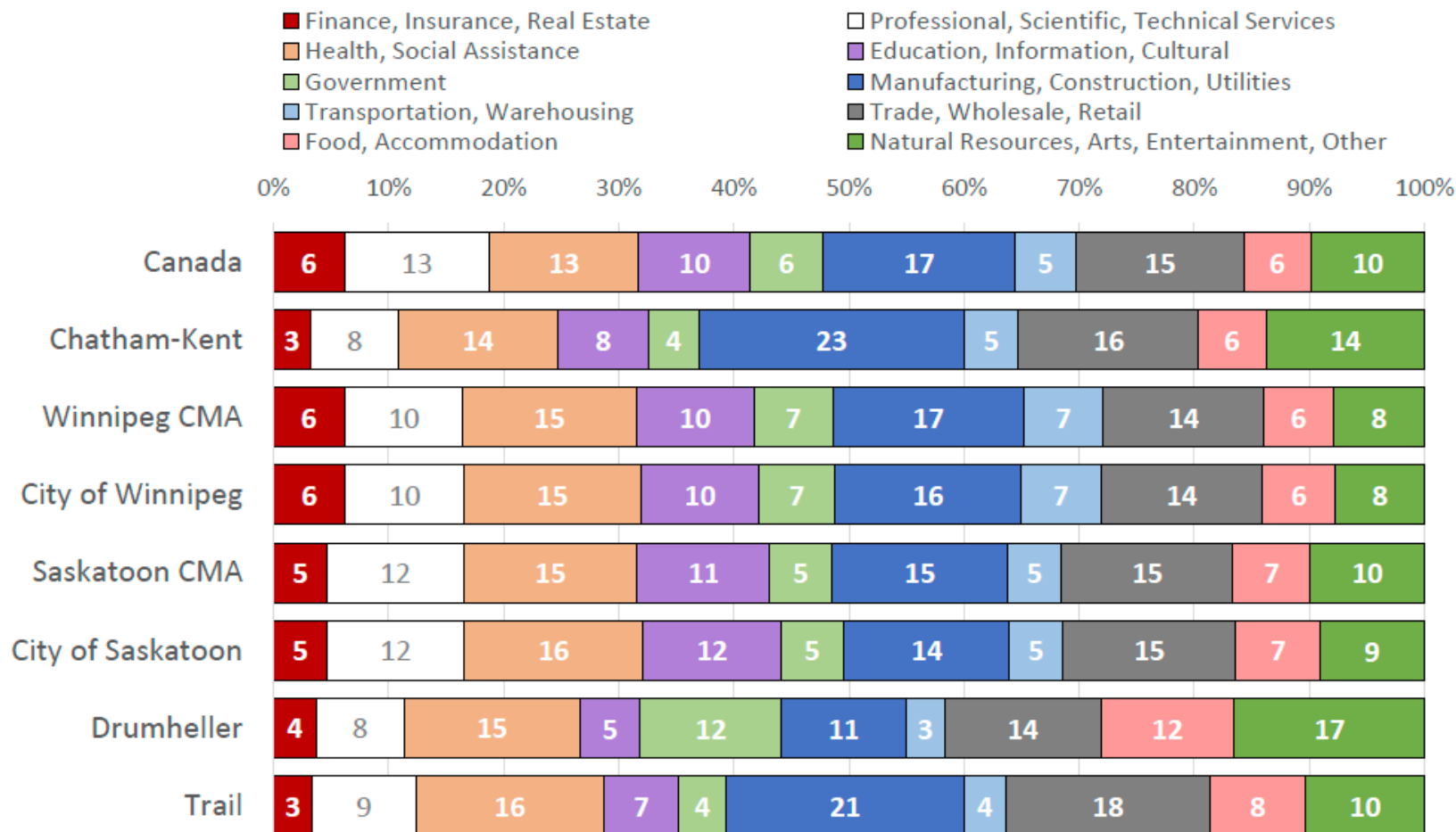

Key Economic Sectors by Employment, 2021

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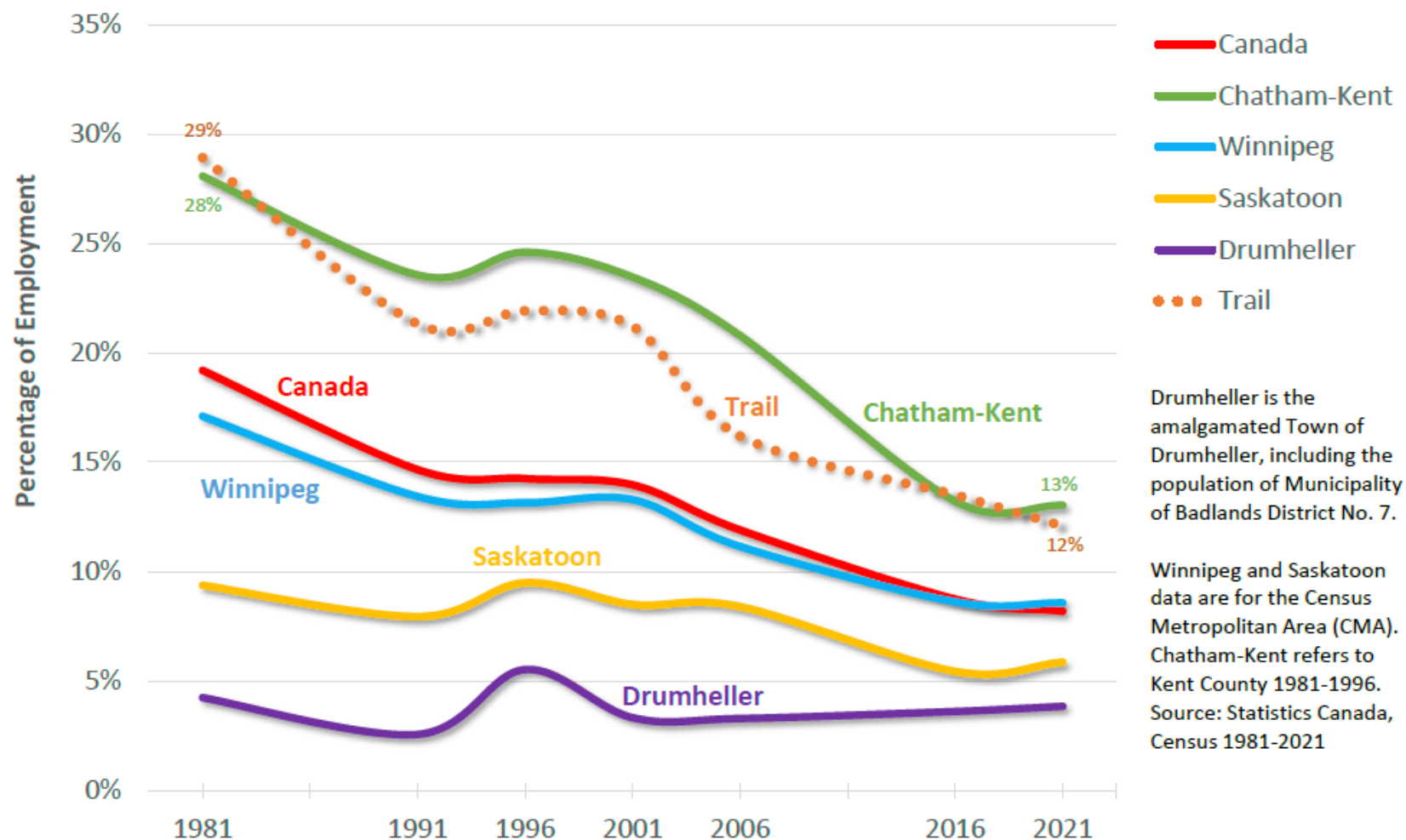

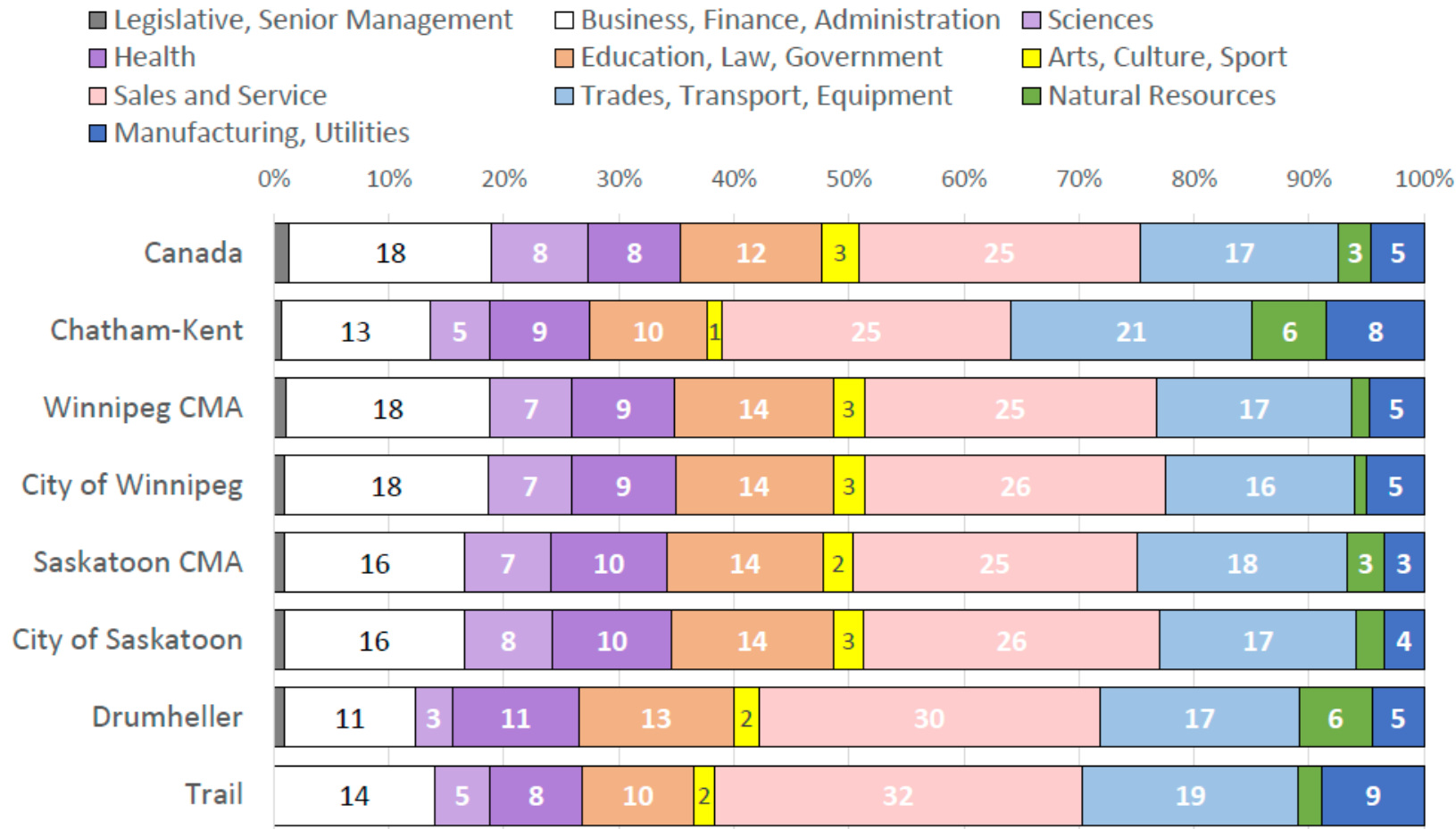
Manufacturing Industry Employment, 1981–2021

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Occupational Structure of Employment, 2021

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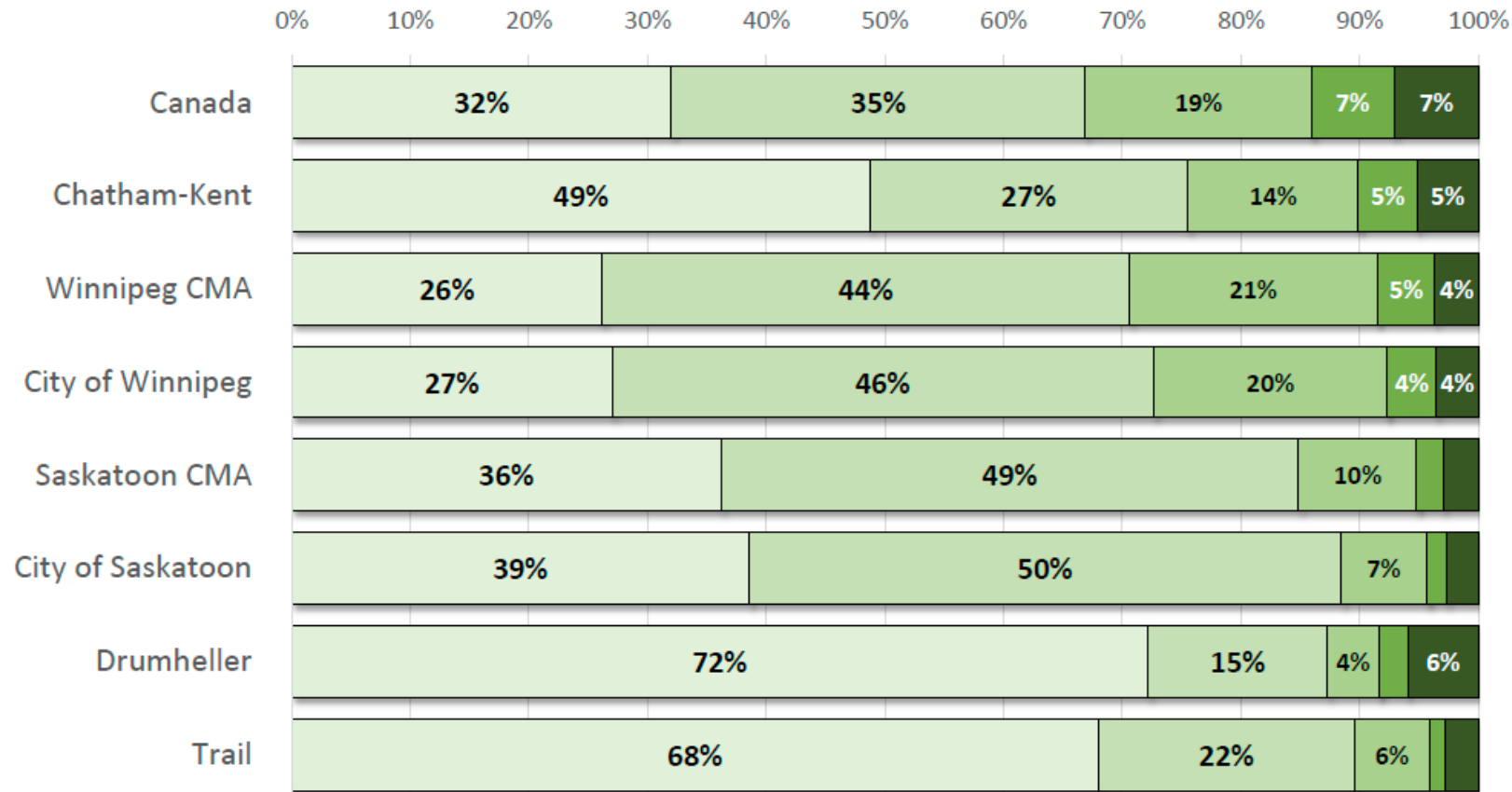

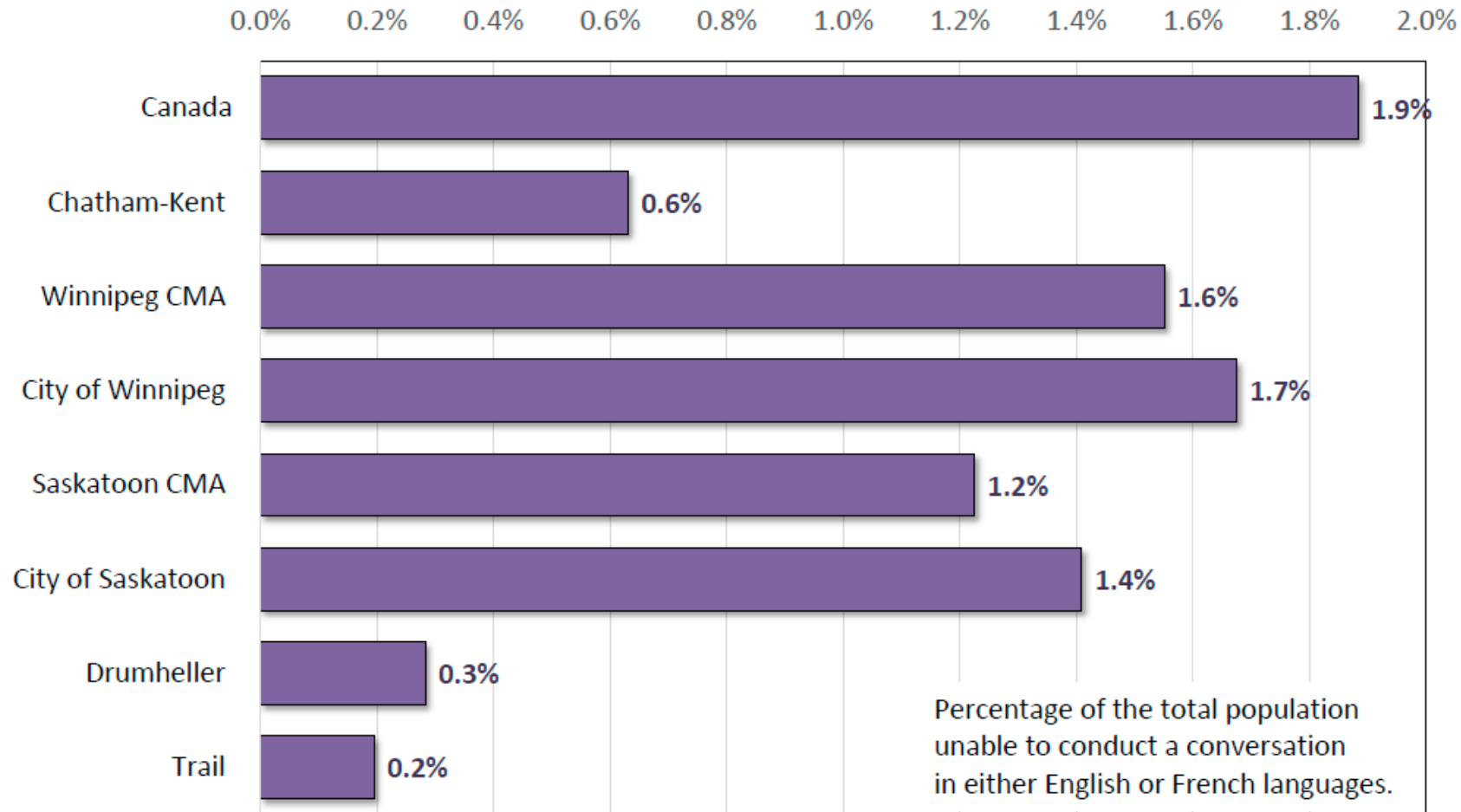

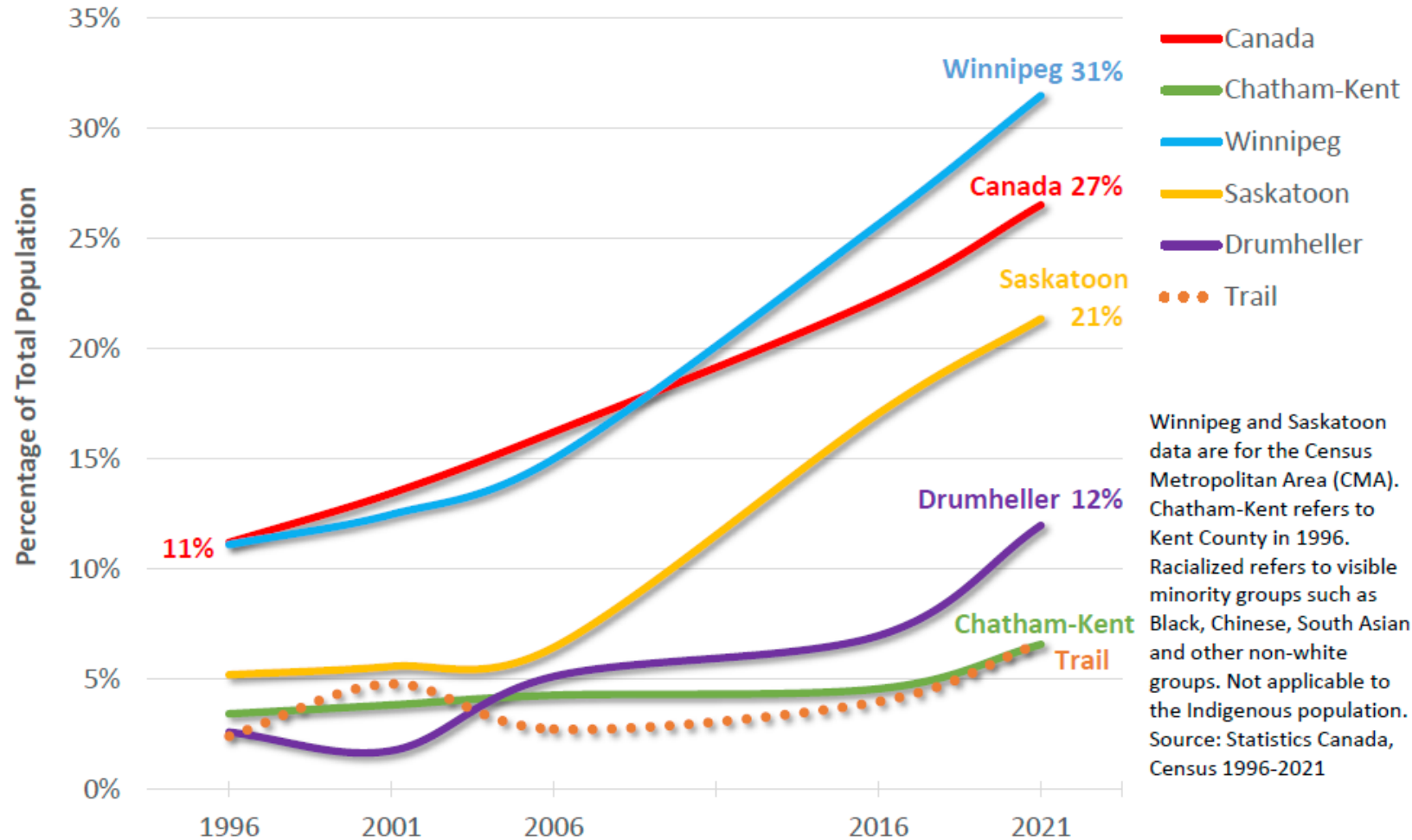

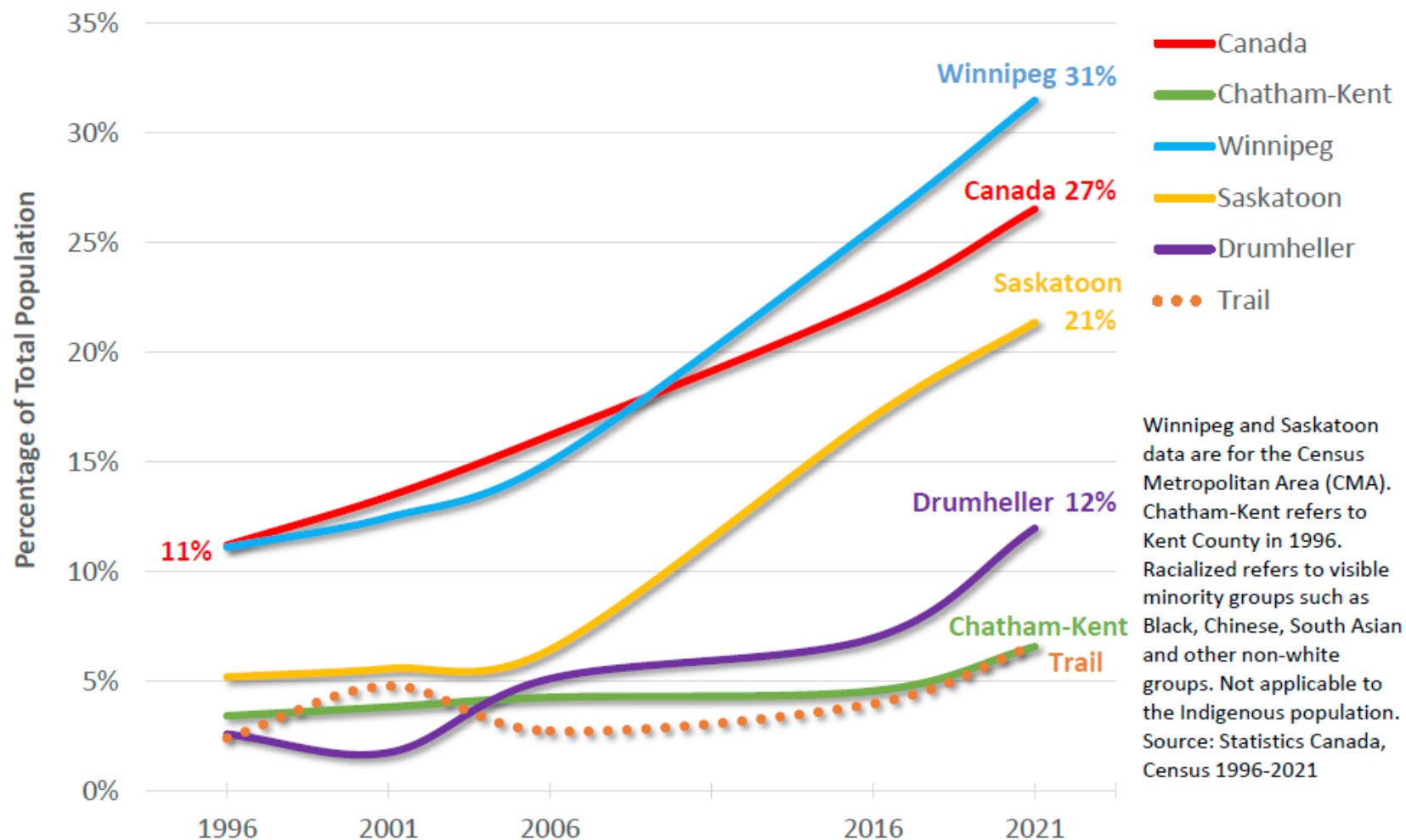
Racialized Population Share, 1996–2021

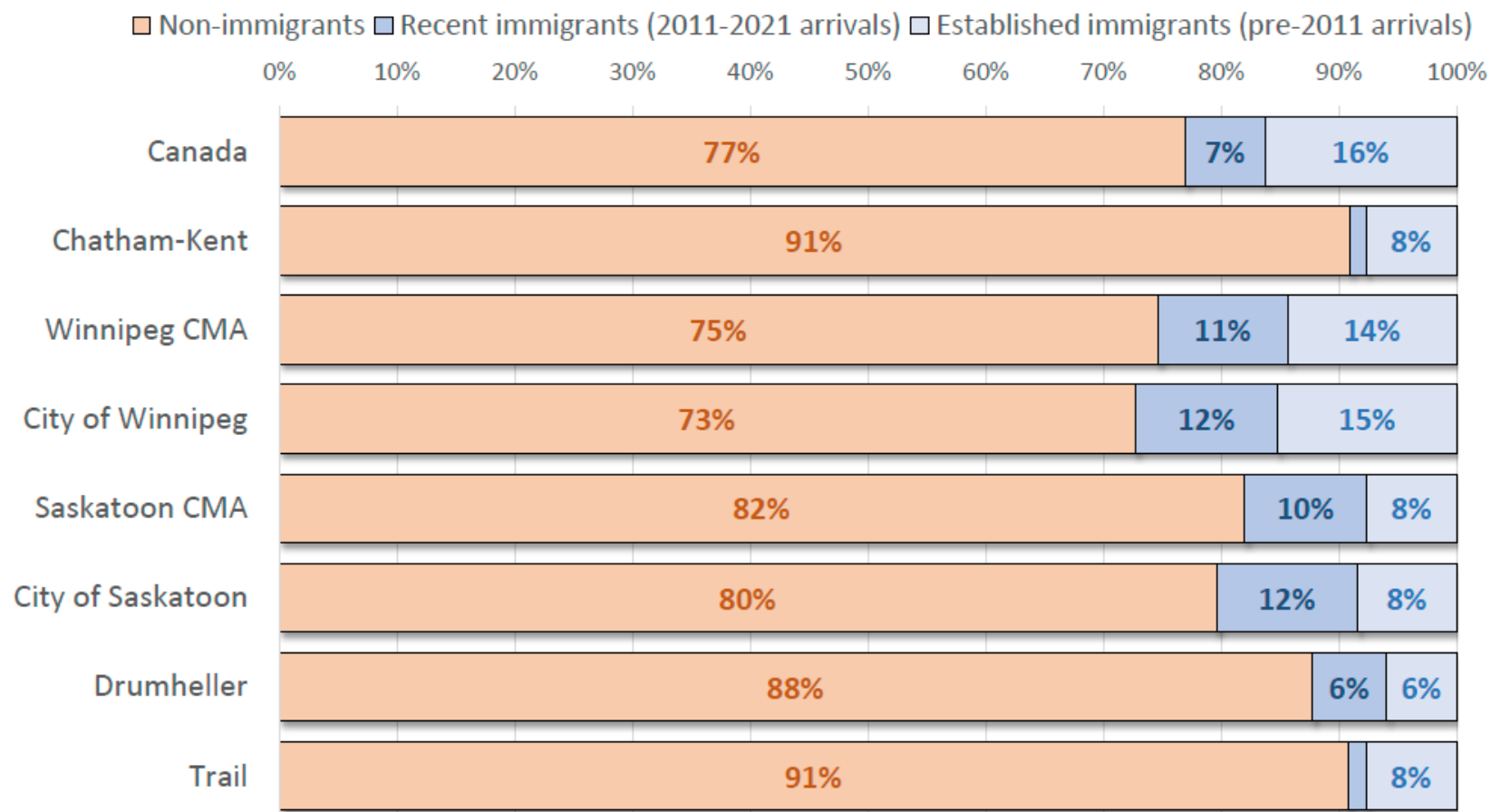
Racialized Population Share, 1996–2021

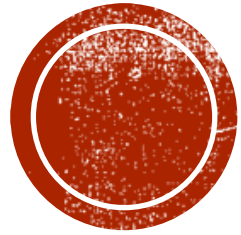
Immigrant Status of the Population, 2021
