#### **OVERVIEW**

Building an effective leadership team, both volunteers and staff, is critical to the successful implementation of a Collective Impact effort. Over time, members of the team will change and shift, but it is critical to start this work with influential champions who are committed to moving the common agenda forward. Developing a set of principles to guide the Collective Impact effort and a shared decision-making process are key. Also important is the development of a governance approach that is flexible

## **LEADERSHIP**

Collective Impact efforts should be designed to move the needle on a complex community challenge or dilemma. Rather than focusing on programmatic solutions, these efforts are more successful when they target systems and policy level change. In the initial article written by John Kania and Mark Kramer on Collective Impact, the authors identified the importance of engaging influential champions around the leadership table.

Influential champions are key, especially when they leverage their spheres of influence to drive change forward. The following resources provide useful advice in engaging and supporting influential champions.

#### BACKBONES IN COLLECTIVE IMPACT

One of the five conditions of a Collective Impact approach is the resourcing of a backbone team. In some Collective Impact efforts, the backbone team consists only of staff assigned to coordinate the work. Other Collective Impact efforts consider the backbone team to include both the staff and the core leadership table, thereby broadening the human resources team. Determining the core roles and functions of the backbone are critical for impactful Collective Impact efforts. The following resources provide a grounding for establishing a backbone team.
