OVERVIEW

Collective Impact is a framework for addressing complex community dilemmas and is most effective when trying to move the needle at a population or systems change scale. It is not a useful framework when the purpose of the collaborative effort is solely to deliver programmatic services or solutions. For the Collective Impact framework to be deployed successfully, the collaborative table should spend time considering a number of pre-conditions before diving into this approach. The pre-conditions of Collective Impact were identified in an article on the framework which appeared in the Stanford Social Innovation Review called Channeling Change: Making Collective Impact Work. Authors John Kania and Mark Kramer of FSG, describe the preconditions as engaging influential champions; determining the urgency of the issue and ensuring

that there are adequate resources to move the needle on the challenge the community is facing.

In addition to the pre-conditions, the Tamarack Institute has identified some other considerations to ensure that Collective Impact is the right approach. These considerations have emerged from our engagement with place-based poverty reduction efforts across Canada, <u>Vibrant Communities:</u> <u>Cities Reducing Poverty</u> and researching the field of collaborative practice. The other considerations include: community readiness; community context and determining the complexity of the issue.

This Compendium of Resources: Building Community Readiness for Collective Impact is targeted at communities considering deploying the Collective Impact framework. Spending time upfront to understand the pre-conditions and other considerations will be valuable in developing an effective and community-focused approach.

The 5 Phases of Collective Impact

THE PRE-CONDITIONS FOR COLLECTIVE IMPACT

The three pre-conditions of Collective Impact include engaging influential community champions; determining the urgency of the community issue to be tackled and ensuring there are adequate human and financial resources. Considering these pre-conditions is essential before stepping up to building a Collective Impact approach. The following papers, tools and online resources will

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS: COMMUNITY READINESS, COMMUNITY CONTEXT, COMPLEXITY OF THE ISSUE

The other considerations including determining community readiness; understanding the local context and how the issue is challenging the local context and focusing on the right strategy for the complex issue.
