

## THE CONTRIBUTION CHALLENGE

Challenge: Whatever impacts can be tracked and measured have also been influenced by multiple factors, not just poverty reduction collaboratives and their partners' interventions.

Our solution: Collaboratives use the language of 'contribution' to impact and determine how much rigour their stakeholders require to demonstrate their level of contribution.

The following methods in Table 2 provide some options for assessing your contribution, based on the level of rigour collaboratives feel is needed.

Table 2 – Contribution Analysis Approaches

Method	Description	Source
<b>Level 1 – Acknowledging</b>		
Use the phrase “Our efforts contributed to...” when you communicate about progress.		
Word Processor	Use the “find” function, look up the words outcomes and impacts, and ensure you are consistently using the term “contribute”	N/A
Editor	Ask the editor to carefully comb all communication outcomes and impacts and make sure you are not implying that you or your partners are fully responsible for outcomes and impact.	N/A
<b>Level 2 – Mapping</b>		
Identify and list the other factors that may have contributed to the outcomes and impact and estimate whether your efforts had low, medium or high contribution.		
Attribution & Contribution Scale	Estimates the extent to which an intervention contributed to the production of outputs and outcomes.	<a href="https://www.participatoryactionresearch.net/tools">https://www.participatoryactionresearch.net/tools</a> see page 115
Causal Dynamics	Estimates the cause and effect relationship of multiple activities and outcomes.	<a href="https://www.participatoryactionresearch.net/tools">https://www.participatoryactionresearch.net/tools</a> see page 125

<b>Level 3 – Investigating</b>		
Greater investment to get a strong estimate of your activities' contributions to outcomes and impact.

Method	Description	Source
