



Role of the Adult Advisor

- First and foremost ensure that the spaces youth are entering are safe and welcoming and that the adults involved are ready to authentically engage with youth participants
- Coordinate monthly meetings for large groups and ensure youth are prepared for and attend their board and commission meetings
- Help youth determine which issues should be raised up to city legislators and our school board
- Work to broaden youth understanding of city government, board governance, etc. through monthly speakers and presentations
- Act as a touchpoint for city staff, board chairs, etc.

What Is a YouthBank?


A YouthBank is a youth-led grant-making organization which channels money into projects that will improve the quality of life of local communities. Local YouthBanks are run by young people for young people. YouthBank is unique in that it puts money directly into the hands of young people who decide on how it will be spent.

- Currently in its ninth year
 - 66 youth have been trained in as team members
 - 108 grant proposals have been received
 - 461 youth (duplicated)
 have been involved in
 writing a grant proposal
 - 299 youth have seen their grant proposal funded
 - As of January 2023, 61 grants have been awarded with a total dollar amount of

\$164,628
