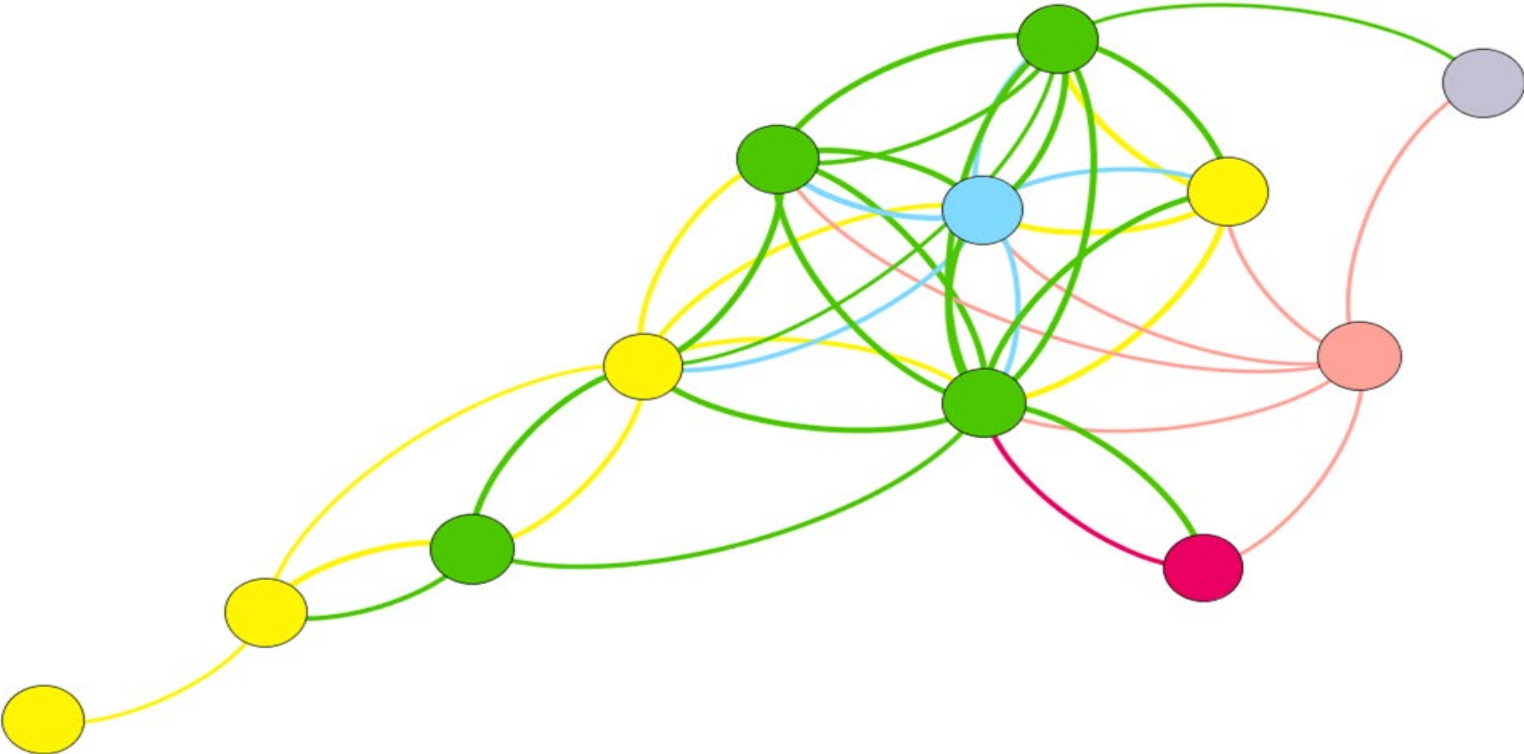

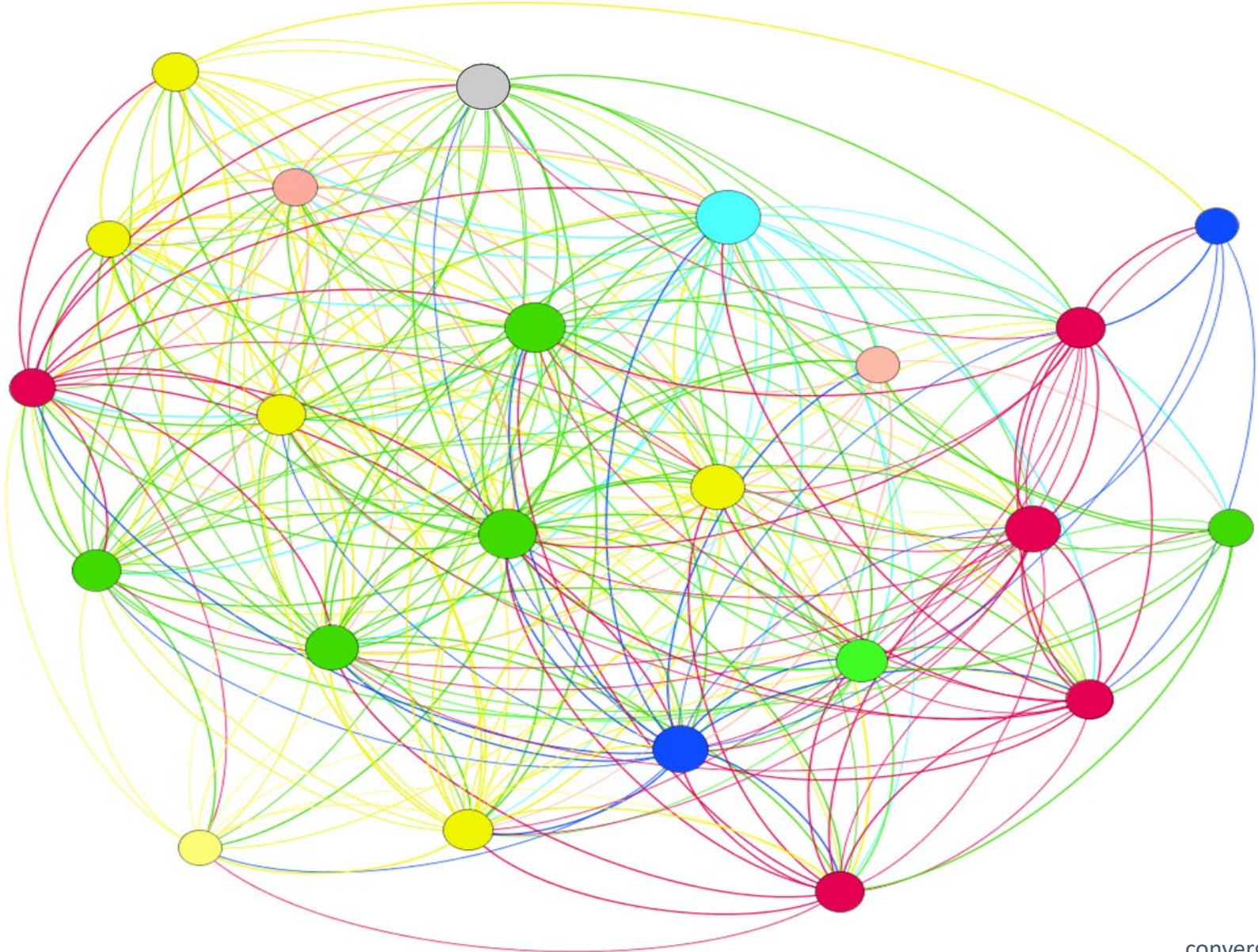

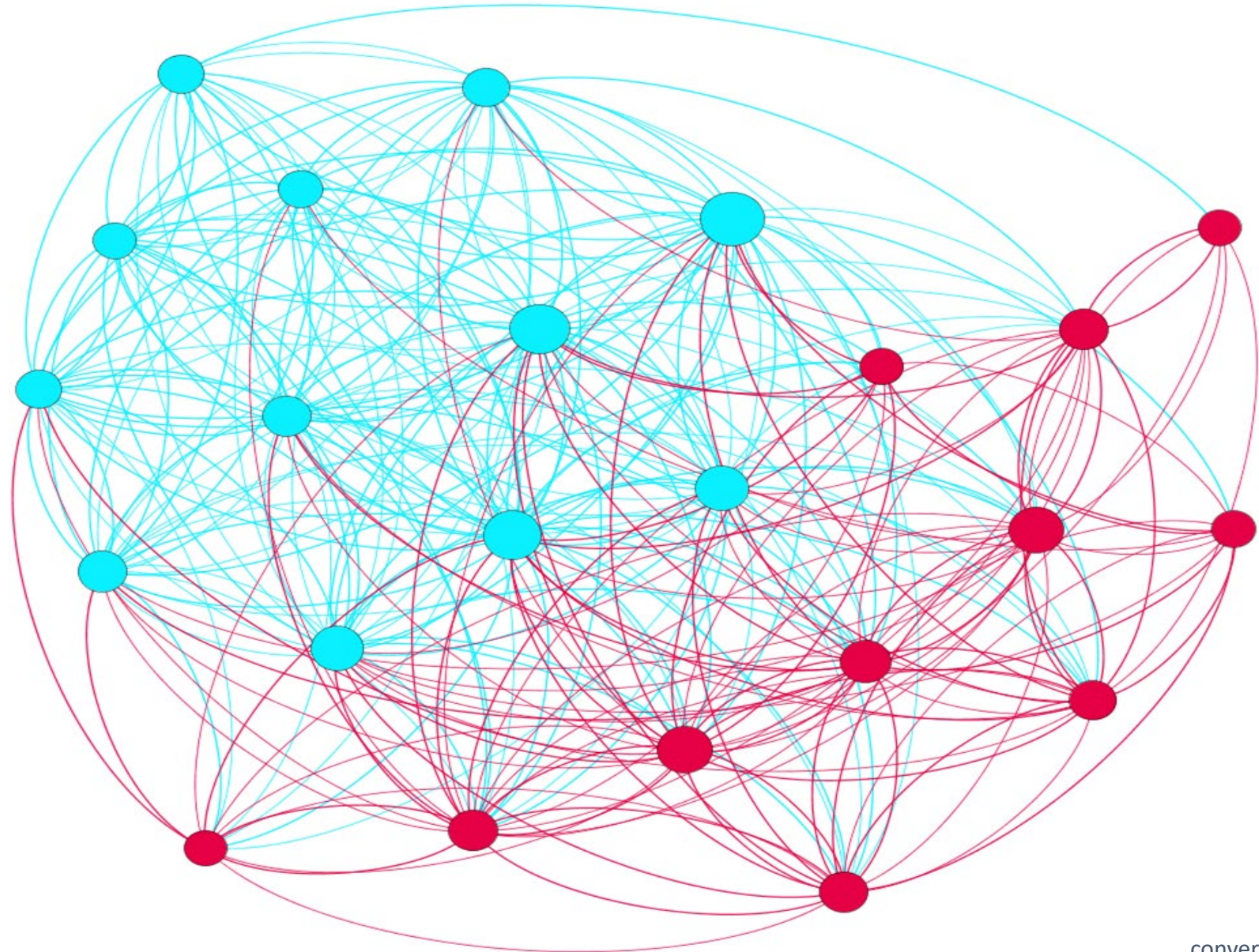

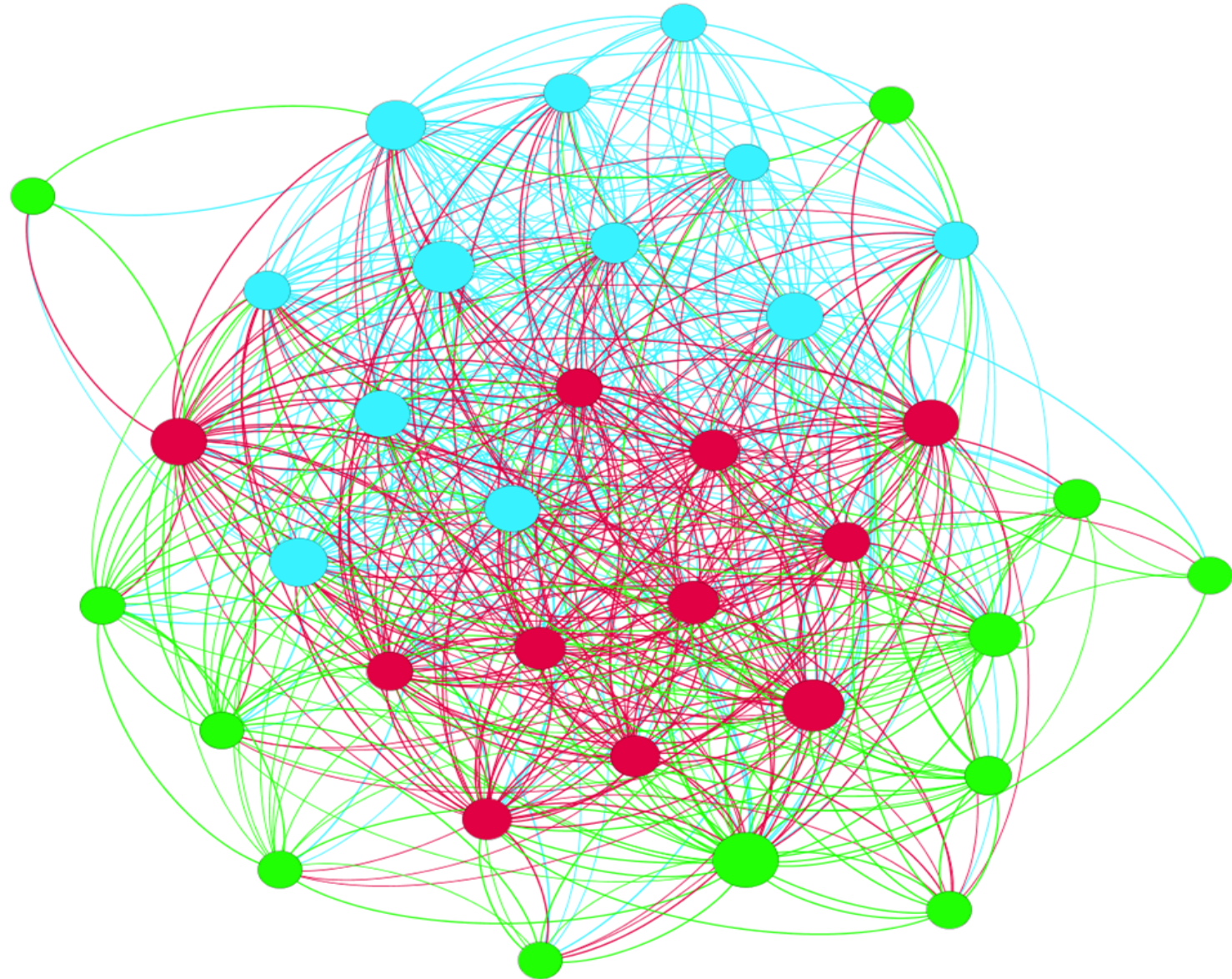

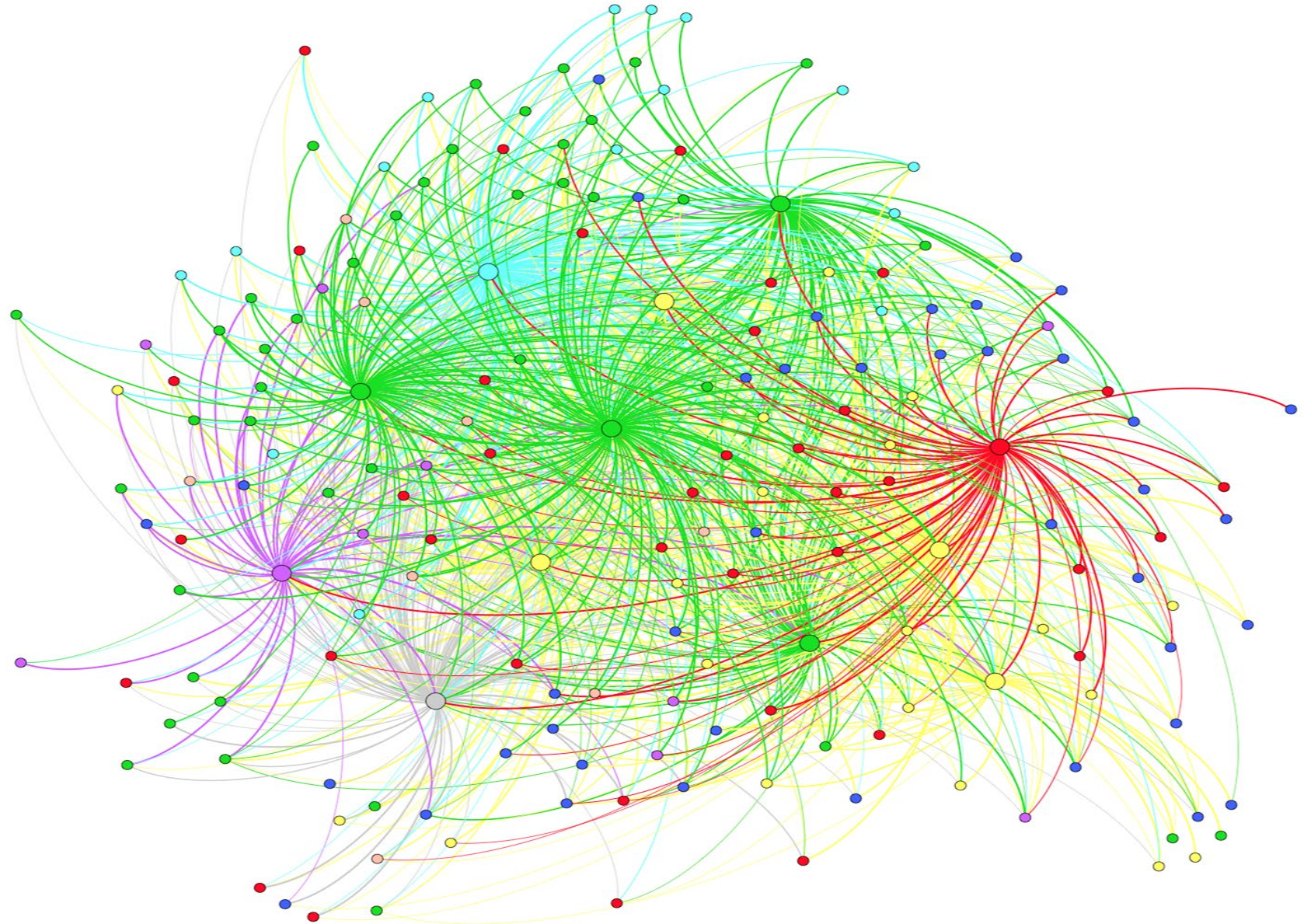

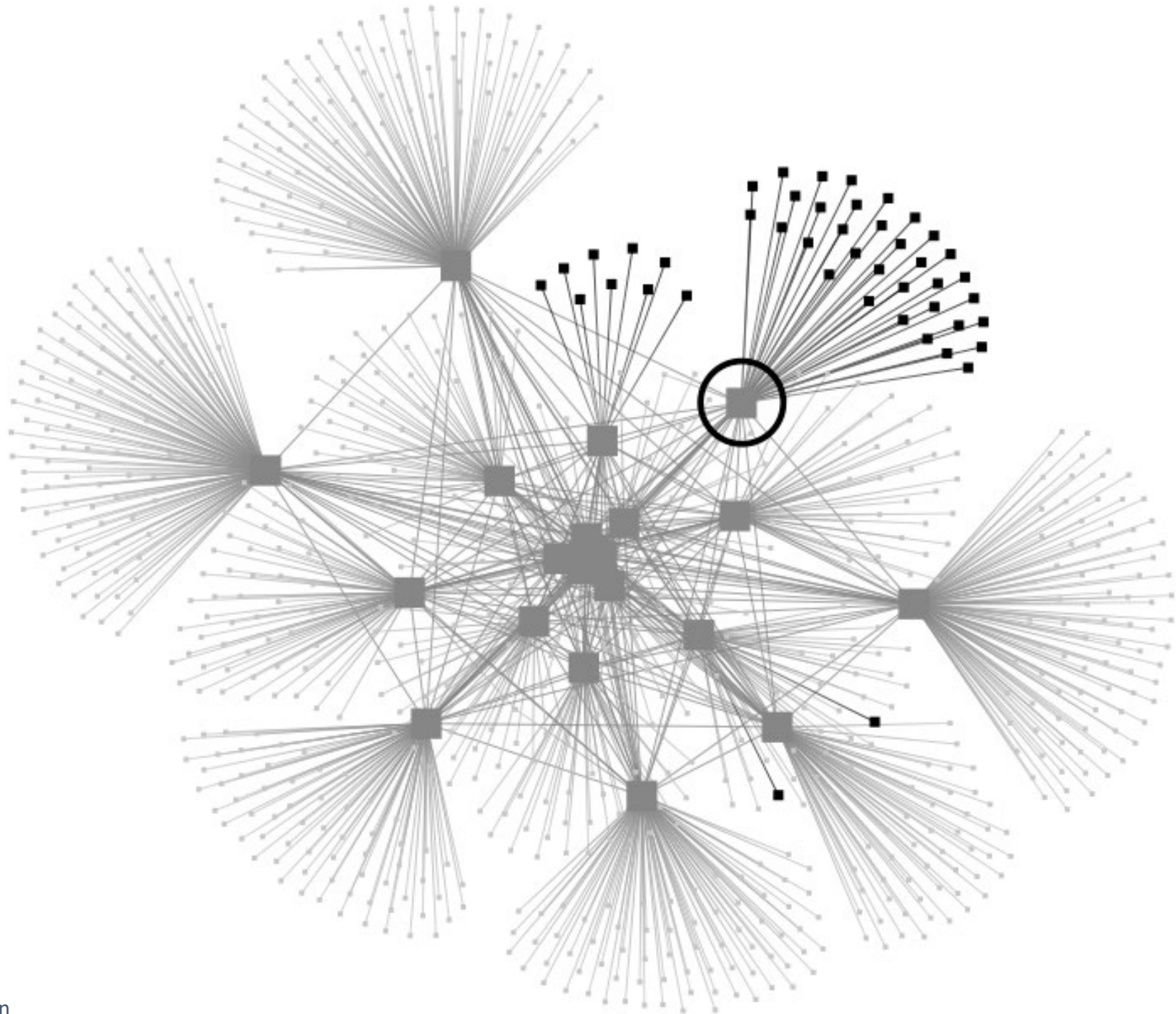


2nd Degree Network for Cohorts 1-3

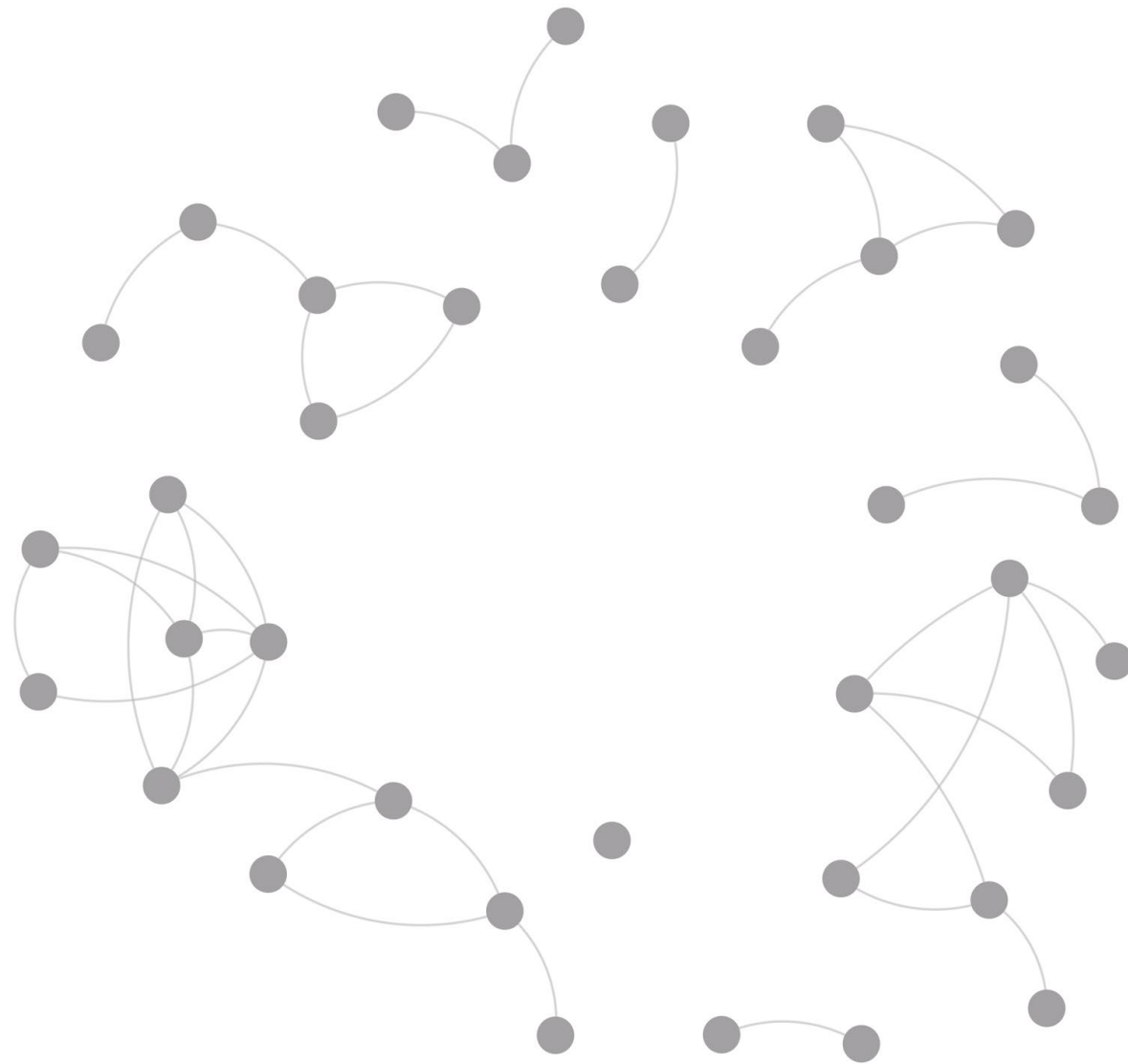
