

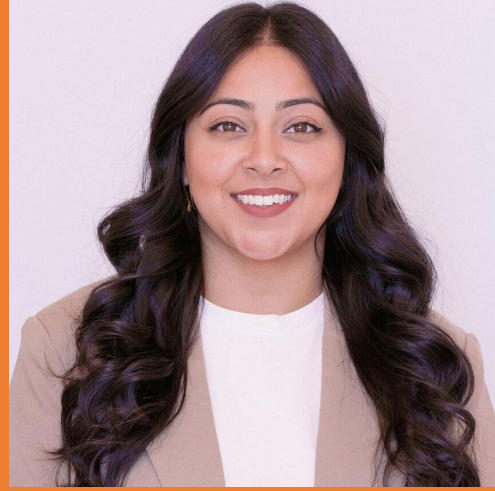

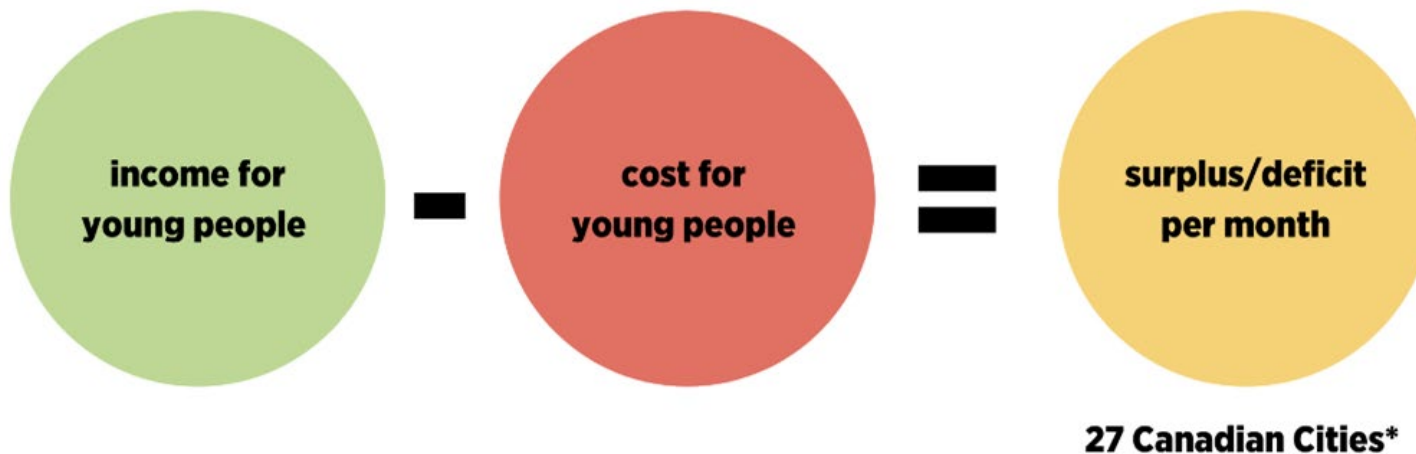

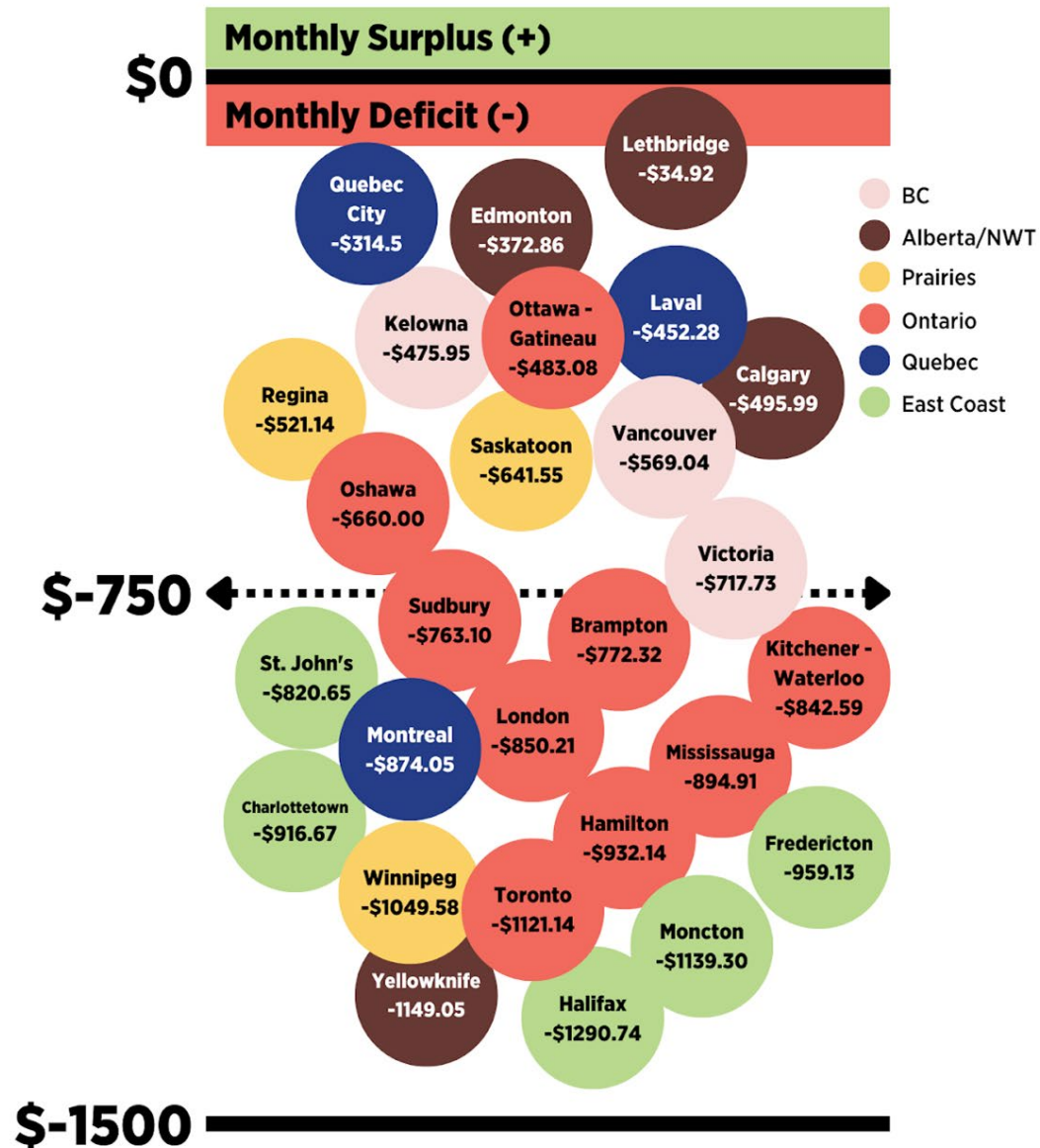

"Young people in Canada run an average deficit of \$750 a month living in cities.

To break even young people would need to isolate themselves – meaning no entertainment, no transportation, and no dining out.
