The immediate problem of "greenwashing" (applies to the making of products AND policy

The Six Sins of Greenwashing

Fibbing

making environmental claims that are simply false



Vagueness

being purposely non-specific about operations or materials



No Proof

making an environmental claim that cannot be substantiated



Lesser Evils

applying a do-good label to an environmentally unfriendly product



Hidden Trade-off

suggesting a product is "green" based on a single environmental attribute



Irrelevance

claiming to avoid using a material or practice that is already illegal or non-standard

THE NECESSARY RESPONSE

A radically new economic paradigm to address the environmental emergency and the economic and social injustices


This new economic paradigm must


- end exploitation
- redistribute wealth and reallocate economic room-to-grow from overdeveloped and overconsuming nations to poorer and developing economies
- reorient our understandings of Mother Earth based on Indigenous values and teachings and on radical political ecology

Alternative conceptions of the political economy

- markets as embedded in societies
- the social economy as an alternative to the globalised capitalist market
- Establishing an overall steady-state economy and planned degrowth at the national and international levels

PRACTICAL STEPS FORWARD

SOCIAL POLICY

- universal basic income
- Adequate, affordable, and green housing
- food security
- health care
- ecologically-focused education

PRACTICAL STEPS FORWARD (continued)

BROADER PUBLIC POLICY

- o transition to green energy sources and net-zero emissions
- low- or no-carbon transportation options
- o green jobs
- labour market restructuring (underpinned by UBI)
- o zero (overall) population growth
- habitat protection
- local planning and zoning

My essential point:



Basic Income is a necessary – but not sufficient – component in a social-ecological transition to a economically just society and an ecologically sustainable economy.
